

John Cardinal O'Connor 1920 - 2000

"Saints of God, come to his aid!

Come to meet him, angels of the Lord!

Receive his soul and present him

to God the Most High."

Beginning at 2:00 p.m. on May 9, 2000, a Mass of Christian Burial concluded four days of services and Masses, allowing many who had worked for the archdiocese or who had served with the Cardinal during his more than 50 years of priesthood, to pay their last respects. It is estimated that more than 60,000 mourners filed past the open casket of John Cardinal O'Connor.

Those of us in the pro-life movement have been inspired and encouraged by the Cardinal's tireless dedication to the Church's teaching that we must protect and promote human life from conception until the moment of natural death. So it saddened us greatly when we learned this past summer that he had a malignant brain tumor.

Despite our prayers & petitions he was taken from us. In the words of Angelo Cardinal Sodano, "Lord, we don't complain because you have taken him from us. But rather, we thank you for giving him to us."

There was a moment during the homily of Cardinal Bernard Law that will be especially remembered by us. Cardinal O'Connor would never intentionally embarrass anyone. Cardinal Law would not have done so either. But a two minute long period of thunderous applause began after the good Cardinal said, "What a great legacy he has left us in his constant reminder that the Church must always be unambiguously pro-life."

The Cardinal was brought, at the end of the funeral Mass, down to the crypt below the cathedral's main altar. There are 21 vaults which hold the remains of the previous eleven leaders of the New York archdiocese. Cardinal O'Connor's casket was placed in the center row of seven, diagonally above the remains of Pierre Toussant, a Haitian slave who died in 1853. His works of charity led Cardinal O'Connor in 1989 to initiate the process for Pierre's sainthood.

We pray for the Cardinal O'Connor's successor, Bishop Edward Egan.

LEGISLATIVE WATCH FEDERAL



THE PAIN RELIEF PROMOTION ACT S.1272-

-use of controlled substances. The House of Representatives passed their version of this bill on 10/99 by a 271-156 vote. We must now urge the Senate to vote on this important legislation.

OTHER PRO-LIFE BILLS IN NEED OF SENATOR SCHUMER'S AND SENATOR MOYNIHAN'S SUPPORT:

All of these bills have passed in the House and now require Senate passage.

- S. 1673--The Unborn Victims of Violence Act.
 This bill recognizes the unborn child as a victim when injured or killed during the commission of a federal crime.
- 2. S.661--The Child Custody Protection
 Act. This bill prohibits the transporting of a
 minor across a state line by anyone other than a
 parent for the purpose of obtaining an abortion.
- 3. A ban on the Partial Birth Abortion procedure. Senator Moynihan who supports the ban calls this form of abortion infanticide. We need Senator Schumer's support.

NEW YORK STATE

INTENTIONAL ASSAULT OR HOMICIDE OF UNBORN BILL S.2171/A.6654. In April of this year, according to police, Dr. Stephen Pack loaded

two needles with methotrexate, a drug used to induce abortion, threw his pregnant girl friend to the ground and injected her six times in the thigh and buttock, while yelling "I am giving you an abortion". If the baby in the uterus of the injured nurse dies before birth, Pack cannot be prosecuted for the homicide. Moreover, he cannot be prosecuted for the attempted attack because the baby is not considered a "person" under N.Y.S. law. Bill S.2171/A.6654 would allow prosecution in assaults of this type.

Sample letter: Dear. Please actively support the Intentional Assault or Homicide of Unborn Bill S.2171/A 6654 to allow prosecution when an unborn child is injured or killed. Passage of the bill will be a first step in protecting the woman whose choice is to have the baby. Please reply. Thank you.

HEALTH & SCIENCE REPORT VACCINES, FETAL TISSUE AND POPULATION CONTROL



"Though few people realize it, fetal tissue was used in the development of the polio vaccine in the 1950's." So writes Mary A. Nicholas, M.D., M.T.S. in the booklet, From the Hunter's Net. This line brought back a recollection of a "Salk Vaccine Timetable" assembled by Randy Engel from Dr. Herbert Ratner's Child and Family Trilogy: An Untold Vaccine Story that read: "January 1950—Salk begins tissue-culture production of poliovirus." When we originally read this in connection with the polio/March of Dimes scandal, we thought the tissue was from the monkeys they had been using for research. We contacted Randy Engel and she thought she had revealed this unethical procedure in more explicit detail. Randy Engel's A March of Dimes Primer-The A-Z of Eugenic Killing states, "On July 22, 1958, the National Foundation of Infantile Paralysis/March of Dimes announced it was turning its sights on preventing birth defects. Still reeling from a bad corporate conscience and massive cover up concerning the 'effective, safe and potent' Salk Inactivated Poliomyelitis Vaccine, 'a vaccine which turned out to be inadequately studied, seriously flawed and prematurely introduced,' the March of Dimes stated it would become a new conscience for America by extending its purview from poliomyelitis to birth defects. And so they went from one injustice to our children to another. Solving the problem of birth defects by detection (amniocentesis) and curing them by killing in utero those affected."

According to Steven Kellmeyer, a Catholic theologian, author and medical laboratory technician, vaccines developed against bacterial infections such as tetanus, whooping cough, typhoid, diphtheria and tuberculosis can be cultivated in the equivalent of chicken broth. Vaccines against viral diseases need a culture of similar cellular material to the viral diseases themselves in order to reproduce. The cultures used for the medium to develop vaccines against polio, measles, rubella, rabies, hepatitis A, yellow fever, Japanese encephalitis, influenza and chicken pox were from aborted babies' fetal tissue cells.

The sickening aspect of this unethical practice is that animal cells can also be used. The inconvenience to manufacturers is that they must prevent animal viruses from passing on to humans in the cultured vaccines. This happened in the 1960's when the Salk polio vaccine produced from the kidney tissue of Rhesus monkeys passed on live simian viruses, which are cancer-producing viruses, to adults and children in the US and around the world. Also, fetal cells can divide many times and can be used repeatedly to develop uniform batches of vaccines.

Dr. Kristine M. Severyn of the Vaccine Policy

Institute, Dayton, Ohio, explains in a most informative and must-read article by Una McManus (Vaccines—Why Their Use May Be Unethical, Catholic Faith and Family, Nov 21-Dec 4, 1999) about the live rubella virus strain named RA 27/3: "R stands for rubella, A stands for abortus, 27 means these cells came from the 27th aborted baby who was dissected before the live virus could be isolated, 3 means the third tissue culture explant. The virus was isolated from this particular baby's kidney."

Some time ago we wrote about the tetanus vaccines containing human chorionic gonadatropin (hCG) that has been used on women, and only women, between 12-49 years of age, in many Third World countries such as Mexico, the Philippines and Tanzania in recent years under the auspices of the World Health Organization (WHO). These women were given injections as many as 5 times over a period of several months, when normally a single injection provides protection for 10 years or more. Vials of the vaccine used were analyzed and were found to contain hCG as well as the tetanus vaccine.

hCG is a naturally occurring hormone that is found in pregnant women. It causes the release of other hormones which prepare the uterine lining for implantation of the fertilized egg. The woman's body does not attack its own naturally occurring hormone. However, when hCG is linked to the tetanus vaccine, the immunological tolerance to hCG is overcome and the hCG is treated like an invading enemy, thus creating an antifertility vaccine. Women who were tested after the tetanus vaccination had antibodies against hCG in their systems. They also had miscarriages, stillbirths or premature births. The question now is, will these women ever be able to maintain a pregnancy? This is another example of how Population Control Groups and eugenicists view the poor and uneducated.

The WHO has been actively involved in the development of this anti-fertility vaccine for over 20 years. The UN Fund for Population Activities, the UN Development Program, the Population Council, the Rockefeller Foundation, the All India Institute for Medical Sciences, and a number of universities, including Uppsala, Helsinki and Ohio State have been working with the WHO on this project. The US National Institute of Child Health and Human Development of the National Institutes of Health supplied the hCG hormone in some of the experiments.

Congress was asked to institute an independent investigation of the facts according to *The Wanderer*. What happened?



When the great epic history of the pro-life movement is finally written, the name of Bishop James T. McHugh will appear over and over again at the most important decision points in our movement's struggle to restore legal protection to the unborn child.

Bishop McHugh has been directly involved in the leadership of the pro-life movement for more than three decades.

Bishop McHugh was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Newark in 1957. He has since served as Director of the Family Life Bureau for

the National Conference of Catholic Bishops (NCCB), Director of the NCCB Pro-Life Activities Office, program director of Natural Family Planning for NCCB, and Consultor to the Pontifical Council for the Family.

In 1988 he was ordained Auxiliary Bishop of Newark, in 1989 he was appointed Bishop of Camden, and in February 1999 he was installed as Coadjutor Bishop of Rockville Centre, and became the Bishop of Rockville Centre in January, 2000.

He also serves as Special Advisor to the Mission of the Permanent Observer of the Holy See to the United Nations and was part of the Vatican's delegation to the U.N. Conferences in Bucharest, Mexico City, and Cairo.

Bishop McHugh has cast a giant shadow in the history of the pro-life movement. More often than not his efforts and input were done behind the scenes--quietly, strategically and yet crucially for the pro-life movement's growth and successes. He is one of the true heroes of the pro-life movement.

PLANNED PARENTHOOD AND POPULATION CONTROL

A major player in population control is International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF). To mask U.S. involvement and allay Third World suspicions, population control aid is funneled through the United Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA) and Non-Governmental Organizations (NGO's) such as IPPF who, with other NGO's were instrumental at the 1994 Cairo Conference in promoting a major effort to redefine contraception to include abortion which by U.N. policy was to be discouraged and never viewed as a method of family planning.

IPPF, UNFPA and other zero population growth advocates claim that cutting funds for family planning has led to thousands of maternal deaths. What is at issue here is that developing countries lack proper immunization programs, lack trained personnel to attend births and proper medical facilities. As U.N. statistics demonstrate, in African nations, where an average of only 15% of all births are attended, the maternal mortality rate is 1,340 per 100,000 births, but where an average of 83% of all births are attended, the maternal mortality rate drops to 520 per 100,000 births. Basic

Health services and sanitation are among the key factors in reducing both infant and maternal mortality.

The concerted efforts to limit population growth by UNPFA and IPPF has resulted in some rather dire consequences and implications for the future. "Humanity's long term problem will not be too many children, but too few." In 1995 the number of countries with below replacement fertility rates was 51, by 2015 it is estimated that 88 of the worlds' 188 countries will have replacement levels at or below the sustaining rate of 2.1 children per woman.

The political rhetoric of IPPF — only wanted children — not only smacks of eugenics, but it is a neo-colonialist policy imposed on Third World nations which are composed of people of color. It is an amoral policy which seeks to promote abortion as a means of population control and detracts from major issues such as the failure of the global community to sustain development in the poorer nations, AIDS, aging and the lack of health care.



THE BARRENNESS OF SUCCESS March 21, 2000: The muffled explosions you hear are the sounds of European populations crashing. According to a recently released UN Report on population, Europe and Japan will undergo dramatic declines in population over the next 50 years. Europe's population will fall by 122 million, while Japan's will shrink by 22 million. Thirty-three countries in all, says the UN, will see their populations decline. The accompanying aging of these populations will shrink the workforce, threaten to bankrupt pension programs and undermine health care for the elderly. Economies may be hobbled and national security compromised as the pool of young people dries up. How would the UN rejuvenate declining populations in the developed world? It proposes to bring in massive numbers of young people from the developing world, in waves of 'replacement migration", to maintain the workforce at its current level. However, birth rates are falling everywhere, not just in the developed countries. As more and more countries fall below replacement, there will be fewer sources of new migrants to make up the developed world's birth dearth in the years to come. Moreover, how can we justify extracting from poorer countries their brightest young minds? And what of the social problems that will accompany this massive influx of new immigrants? Once people reach a certain level of wealth, they can be easily convinced not to replace themselves. Then when Planned Parenthood says that "Babies are not sweet little things. They wet and dirty themselves, they get sick, they're very expensive to take care of," the message hits home. And home stays empty. www.pop.org; weekly briefing 3/24/00



Answer: To be Pro Choice about abortion is to be Pro Abortion

Some people have the illusion that being personally opposed to abortion while believing others should be free to choose it is some kind of compromise between the pro abortion and pro life positions. It isn't. Pro choice people vote the same as pro abortion people. Both oppose legal protection for the innocent unborn. Both are willing for children to die by abortion and must take responsibility for the killing of those babies even if they do not participate directly. To the baby who dies it makes no difference whether those who refused to protect her were pre-abortion or merely pro choice.

What is Legal is Not Always Right

One of the weakest arguments for the legitimacy of abortion is that it is legal. Civil law does not determine morality. Rather, the law should reflect a morality that exists independently of the law. Can anyone seriously believe that abortion was immoral on January 21, 1973, and moral on January 23, 1973? If abortion killed children before the law changed, it continues to kill children after the law changed. Law or no Law, either abortion has always been right and always will be, or it has always been wrong and always will be.
