'TAXPAYER MONEY SWELLING PLANNED PARENTHOOD'S COFFERS'

The Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA) released its 1998-1999 Annual Report in February. The document drew immediate criticism from STOPP International director Jim Sedlak.

"The Annual Report makes clear the inordinate amount of profits PPFA makes from its operations", said Sedlak.

"Each year, since 1995, PPFA has showed a steady rise in its profits (income in excess of expenditures)," commented Sedlak, "but its \$125.8 million profit this year is just obscene. For an organization that frequently laments that it needs government support and deserves special pricing from drug companies, to post this kind of profit, year after year, is reprehensible."

Sedlak, whose organization publishes an annual report of PPFA's finances, pointed out that PPFA has had a total profit of \$355.6 million over the last 13 years and "not once, in that time, did it ever report a loss."

"PPFA reported in its Annual Report that it currently has net assets totaling \$536.3 million. It increased its net assets by \$131.5 million in just one year," said Sedlak.

"These numbers may be wonderful if PPFA was just a normal business," said Sedlak, "But the organization claims to be a charity and wants all kinds of special deals – including reduced-rate advertising in the media. It's time the American public saw PPFA for what it is, a business intent on making as much profit as it can!"

"Taxpayer money is swelling PPFA's coffers," said Jim Sedlak, director of STOPP International.

The PPFA Annual Report states that, in its 1998-1999 fiscal year, PPFA received \$176.5 million in government grants and contracts. Sedlak estimates that 75% of that comes from the federal government and the remainder from state and local governments. This means that PPFA gets approximately \$132.4 million from the federal government. The PPFA Annual Report stated that its net assets increased by \$131.5 million during its last fiscal year. "The numbers reveal the truth," said Sedlak. "All the federal money to PPFA was not needed to cover its expenses. It went, instead, to swell its bottom line. American taxpayers are scrimping and saving to pay taxes that are being used simply to increase the bank accounts of Planned Parenthood. It's an outrage!" Sedlak noted that Clinton's proposed 2001 budget does not cut back on money to Planned Parenthood, but rather, will actually increase taxpayer money to the organization.

"Over the last 13 years, the taxpayer has dumped over \$1.8 billion into Planned Parenthood with no observable benefit—unless you count more money in PPFAa's accounts as a benefit. It is time we put an end to this government largesse."

Sedlak called on every citizen to contact members of Congress and insist that they begin to cut government funding of Planned Parenthood. "I call on every candidate for public office," Sedlak concluded, "to declare their intentions to cut this wasteful spending and end government funding of Planned Parenthood."

THE STATUS OF THE BAN ON PARTIAL BIRTH ABORTIONS (PBA)—The House of Representatives overwhelmingly passed the PBA ban on 4/5/00 by 287-142. The U.S. Senate is about to vote on a ban on PBA with similar wording.

Thirty-one state legislatures have also passed bans on PBA, some of which have been struck down by their own state's courts for vagueness. Nebraska's 7th Court of Appeals declared their state's ban unconstitutional after abortionist LeRoy Carhart appealed. Presently we await a decision by the U.S. Supreme Court on the constitutionality of the ban on PBA passed in Illinois and Nebraska.

WHY THE OUTCRY OVER PARTIAL-BIRTH ABORTION? WHY IS THIS PROCEDURE (ALSO KNOWN AS THE D&X ABORTION) BEST DESCRIBED AS INFANTICIDE?

NEW YORK STATE--The New York State Legislature will recess for the year at the end of June 2000. Bills not passed by both the N.Y.S. Senate and Assembly and signed into law by Gov. 
---Read all requests for funding. If you are not going to contribute because of the candidate's stand on the life issues return the letter with a note saying his/her stand on the life issues is not acceptable.


Guided by ultrasound, the abortionist grabs the baby's leg with forceps.

DECISIONS, DECISIONS, DECISIONS

Who will be making your life-sustaining decisions? What are life-sustaining treatments? Let's start with the legal definition of life-sustaining treatment as used in the Family Health Care Decisions Act in the NYS Senate and Assembly: "means any medical treatment or procedure without which the patient will die within a relatively short time, as determined by an attending physician to a reasonable degree of medical certainty." If we were unable to drink or eat on our own, would our inability to supply our needs for nutrition and hydration (food and water), which would have to be supplied via gastric (stomach) tube or IV, be considered a procedure over and above comfort needs? The answer is YES! Could someone decide to stop these "procedures"? The answer is YES! How can this be in legislation that is 25 pages long, and seemingly so involved in every aspect of health care decisions? Easily, by being deliberately vague on specific patient needs and obliterating culpability. For example: the legislation leads off with, "This legislation establishes a procedure to facilitate responsible decision-making by surrogates on behalf of patients who do not have capacity to make their own health care decisions." Who decides on a patient's capacity and what does capacity really mean? Which of Webster's definitions apply: legal qualification, competency, power, fitness, ability, caliber, power to grasp and analyze ideas and cope with problems, potentiality?

A surrogate or health care agent may have been selected by the patient, but if it is deemed that clear and convincing evidence of their treatment wishes is not available and if an attending physician determines the patient lacks decision-making capacity to "a reasonable degree of certainty..." decisions to withhold or withdraw life-sustaining treatment "may be made." Health care providers shall not be required to inform the patient or surrogate of the confirmation of "lack of capacity."

The legislation further reads: "Nothing in this article shall obligate health care providers to seek the consent of a surrogate if an adult patient has already made a decision about the proposed health care, expressed orally or in writing, including a decision about withdrawing or withholding lifesustaining treatment." How can anyone prove what was supposed to have been said orally? How could a surrogate make a future informed decision if he was not informed? The legislation also throws the decision making in the health care provider's hands if no surrogate is reasonably available, willing and competent to act..." That's an open invitation to usurp decision making!

What about culpability? Section 2995-0, Immunity, says it all: No Ethics Review Committee, No Health Care Providers or employers, No Surrogates, Patients, Guardians, "No Person shall be subjected to criminal or civil liability or be deemed to have engaged in unprofessional conduct..."

All our fears should then dissipate, for the legislation goes on to read, "Nothing in this article is intended to permit or promote suicide, assisted suicide, or euthanasia." Now doesn't that make you feet better? Why would they think we would ever come to those conclusions?

Eileen Doyle, RN, of NYS Nurses for Life, Inc. has written a wonderful pamphlet on the Family Health Care De-

cisions Act. The title page reads, "Too Much Power for the Surrogate—Too Little Protection for the Patient." She goes on to say, "Patients who are not imminently dying but are diagnosed as permanently unconscious could be denied food and water by feeding tube. Death would result from dehydration and starvation rather than from their underlying disability... The diagnosis of permanent unconsciousness is not always as accurate and predictable as the public has been led to believe. Some of these patients who would have eventually recovered will lose their lives as a direct result of denying them their most basic right to care." She states from the Archives of Neurology: "of 84 patients with a firm diagnosis of persistent vegetative state (PVS), 41% became conscious by 6 months, 52% by 1 year, and 58% within 3 years. There was no way to predict at the onset which patients would eventually recover." Other studies showed that 95% of PVS patients were not terminally ill.

Bishop James T. McHugh, Diocese of Rockville Centre, NY said: "Food and water does not cure the PVS patient; it maintains life. It does not cause suffering for the patient nor is it considered exceptional or experimental medical technology. If the nutrition is discontinued, then the patient will die because a new cause of death has been introduced, that is, from a deliberately intended deprivation of nourishment, or, in common language, from starvation."

We use the Family Health Care Decisions Act as an example. There are pro-euthanasia bills in many state legislatures. We must be more observant, we must act immediately to secure the protection from our representatives in Congress and State Legislatures for basic life protections, especially when we are most vulnerable. Will we vote in courageous leadership? Msgr. James Lisante recently said that without life, what other injustices would really matter?

"Social scientists tell us that our society has reached an imbalance between generations," writes Drew DeCoursey in his book, Lifting the Veil of Choice Defending Life. "The elderly are becoming more numerous; the youth more scarce. Even retirement is in jeopardy. It is the young workers who pay the Social Security benefits of the retired... As our generation moves beyond productivity into retirement, we may find it is we who have become inconvenient. The young may impose on the mature what we taught them through the fruits of Roe v Wade: if a life is inconvenient, we may choose to terminate it."

We believe that proponents of Euthanasia and Doctor-Assisted Suicide are stimulating a fear in the elderly as to what awaits them as their longevity brings on a greater possibility of terminal illnesses and body insufficiency. In their Handbook on Euthanasia, Susan M. and Robert L. Sassone write: "If we give our dying the proper care, the demand for euthanasia would disappear." They quote Dr. Richard Lamerton of Hospice "...Once a patient feels welcome and not a burden to others, once his pain is controlled and other symptoms have been at least reduced to manageable proportions, then the cry for euthanasia disappears." A caption under a cartoon in their book says "A Euthanasia law would help the angel of death kiss you on the nose before you're ready." We love angels and ask for their assistance, but with your help, may we be able to thwart this stalker!



PRO CHOICE ARGUMENTS

Argument: "The anti-abortion beliefs of the minority

shouldn't be imposed on the majority."

Answer: Major polls clearly indicate it is a majority, not a minority, who believe there should be greater

restrictions on abortion.

In 1989 The Boston Globe, a Pro-Abortion newspaper, reported the results of its own survey: "Most Americans would ban the vast majority of abortions performed in this country." The Globe found that "while 78% of the nation would keep abortion legal in limited circumstances, those circumstances account for only a tiny percentage of the reasons cited by women having abortions." The "limited circumstances" were rape, incest, danger to the mother's life, and deformity of the child. But in cases where pregnancy poses financial or emotional strain, or when the woman is alone or a teenager (i.e. Birth Control) - in other words 97% of actual situations – an overwhelming majority of Americans believe abortion should be illegal.

The most comprehensive abortion survey ever taken was a Gallup Poll released in 1991. It showed that 77% of Americans believe abortion takes a human life. The most startling discovery of the Gallup Poll was that only 11% of Americans have an accurate understanding that abortion is available throughout all nine months of pregnancy.
