I want to share with you this picture of our first bus-shelter billboard located outside the abortion mill at 1103 Stewart Avenue, Garden City. Everyone entering or leaving the mill has to go past this ad and it is seen by passers-by as well! A heartfelt thanks to all who are responding so generously to our appeal. Soon more of these ads will be placed in strategic locations throughout Nassau County.

The telemarketing we did to fund these bus shelter ads was the first we have done since 1999. We made ends meet last year thanks to everyone's generosity throughout the year. Your response when I asked for help in last June's *Life News* was especially gratifying.

I pray that you will be as generous this June as you were last June. Contributions received for the bus shelter ads will be used only for that purpose. We need additional donations to pay the bills for *Life News* (see page 1) and our numerous other activities.



One such activity which has gotten harder and harder to fund is our monthly lobbying trip to Albany from January to June each year. With increased fuel prices, the buses now cost nearly \$1000 each trip. We were only able to pay for two this year. Thankfully the Knights of Columbus supported another and we were able join with Long Island members of New Yorkers for Constitutional Freedoms for a fourth trip. Without increased general contributions or specific gifts earmarked for the lobbying trips, we will not be able to see the New York legislative session to its close this year. We also need to be there to voice our opposition to anti-life legislation such as the proposed mandates for health insurance coverage of abortifacient contraceptives and embryo-destroying forms of in-vitro fertilization.

THE UNBORN VICTIMS OF VIOLENCE ACT, H.R. 503, passed in the House by a 252-172 vote and is the first piece of pro-life legislation to come up under the George W. Bush presidency. H.R. 503, also known as the Fetal Protection Bill, recognizes two victims, the mother and the unborn child, when an unborn baby is injured or killed in the commission of any of 68 federal crimes or crimes under military law. Those who opposed H.R. 503 sought to recognize only one victim, the mother. Their reasoning is that protecting unborn children from violent criminal acts might induce people to think more deeply about the humanity of the unborn.

NEW YORK STATE





As of 5/9/01 many Pro-life bills have been introduced in the N.Y. S. Legislature, but most have not been voted out of committee. Please contact your State Senators and Assembly Members asking them to co-sponsor and support Pro-Life bills including:

- Unborn Victims of Violence Act S.57A/A.6681
- The Parental Notification Bill S.3277/A.7685

•Women's Right to Know legislation S.4003/A.3684 •The Family Protection Act S.4836

The latter bill, <u>which needs an Assembly sponsor</u>, was introduced on 4/17/01. It includes parental consent for minors under 18 and "Casey Style" Right to Know Statutes declared constitutional by Supreme Court.

Of the bills listed, the Unborn Victims of Violence Bill S.57.A/A.6681, a bill to criminalize acts of assault or homicide against an unborn child, seems to have the best chance of passage. Senate bill S.57. A was introduced by Senator Maltese, and cosponsored by Senators Farley, Johnson, Marchi, Padavan and Trunzo. Assembly bill A.6681 was introduced by Assemblyman Vitalino, and cosponsored by Assembly Members Weisenberg and Cook.

FETAL PAIN - PART I



"Doctor, what does the aborted baby feel while it's dying?" "Oh, I think that depends on your philosophy." (Mike Levy interview with abortionist Michael Ballard)

Our research into studies on fetal pain revealed that pain receptors spread over the baby's body in stages from 8 weeks gestation, and pain impulse connections in the spinal cord link up and reach the thalamus starting at 7 weeks. (Dr. Paul Ranalli) Because of movement of the fetus at 5.5 weeks, it has been suggested that suffering may begin at this stage.

Our objective in writing this article is the hope that this information will encourage a public outcry for an end to barbarous abortion procedures, or the use of anesthesia for the baby during the abortion. Nothing we write will ever convince abortionists to give up their lucrative practices. Mary Keary, leader of Britain's National Abortion Campaign said, "Pain is a factor in life; could an element of pain be a justification for no more abortions? I don't think so."

Dolores Bernadette Grier, founder and president of Americans Against Abortion Society, answers the question in all our minds, that with all the knowledge, skills, and technical instruments available today for the unborn baby's welfare, why does the abortion holocaust continue? She writes, "What drives a doctor of medicine, trained to heal, to kill an unborn child, alive and growing in the mother's womb, to dismember the baby's body, crush the head, evacuate the dead body and dispose of it in the trash or sell it for experimentation? — Monetary greed!"

In 1984, President Ronald Reagan said, "When the lives of the unborn are snuffed out, they often feel pain, pain that is long and agonizing." Many rose up to protest his disclosure. A group of 26 doctors, including pain specialists, confirmed his statement: "As physicians, we, the undersigned are pleased to associate ourselves with you in drawing the attention of people across the nation to the humanity and sensitivity of the human unborn...Over the last 18 years, real time ultrasonography, fetoscopy, study of the EKG and fetal EEG have demonstrated the remarkable responsiveness of the human fetus to pain, touch, and sound ... We state categorically that no finding of modern fetology invalidates the remarkable conclusion drawn . . . by the late Professor Arnold Gesell of Yale University (1945) ... 'and so by the close of the first trimester the fetus is a sentient, moving being . . .' Mr. President, in drawing

attention to the capability of the human fetus to feel pain, you stand on firmly established ground."

Dr. Vincent J. Collins, Diplomate and Fellow, American Board of Anesthesiologists, and recognized world authority on pain states, "As early as 8-10 weeks gestation, and definitely by 13½ weeks, the human fetus experiences organic pain." Dr. Thomas Sullivan, a pediatric neurologist, and Dr. William Matviuw, OB/GYN, agree with Dr. Collins' pain time-frame. In Brian Clowes' book, <u>The Facts of Life</u>, there is a very informative section on the developing pain responses of the unborn child from day 56 (8 weeks) on. S. Reinis and J. M. Goldman in their textbook, <u>The Development of the</u> <u>Brain</u>, write, "... 13.5 to 14.5 weeks, the entire body surface, except for the back and the top of the head, are sensitive to pain."

Life Dynamics interviewed Susanne Besser (July 2000 video) on fetal pain management and compassionate care in administering anesthesia for fetal surgery. Susanne referred to the British Medical Journal's report on fetal response to pain, that at 10–13 weeks gestation there was a 180% increase in cortisone, a nerve chemical reaction consistent with pain perception, almost twice as much as a newborn with the same pain stimuli. The increase also correlated with the duration of the painful stimulus.

Jean Wright, M.D., Medical Director, Egleston Children's Hospital writes, "Thus the pain experienced during partial-birth abortions by the human fetus would have a much greater intensity than any similar procedure performed in older age groups. This procedure, if it was done on an animal in my institution, would not make it through the institutional review process. The animal would be more protected than the child is."

PLANNED PARENTHOOD'S TEEN HEALTH CONFERENCE, FRIDAY, APRIL 27.

We were able to cover the West entrance to the Windham Wind Watch all morning and the East entrance part of the morning. We observed 36 school buses, 5 vans, 12 sedans and one taxi carrying a total of approximately 568 teens into the Conference.

Thanks to Ignatius for covering the East entrance and to Eileen and the eight girls from St. Patrick's Rosary group for their prayerful witness.

Among the schools in attendance were West Babylon, Montauk, Lindenhurst, Kings Park, Islip, Hauppauge, Half Hollow Hills, Huntington, Deer Park, Daytop, Boces and Bayport/Bellport.

School Administrators that condone student participation in this conference are in violation of NY State Department of Education Regulation 135,3 on <u>health education</u> and risk litigation if a teenager comes forward with a pregnancy or STD after being told that contraceptives will protect them.

Question: How does abortion cause tubal pregnancy?

Answer: If the abortionist's curette scrapes or cuts too deeply across the opening of the tubes, there is scar formation. When partial blockage is a result of this procedure, the microscopic sperm can still travel through the tube to fertilize the ovum as it breaks out of the ovary. After fertilization, this new human life, many hundred times larger than the sperm, may not be able to get back through the tube if it has been partly scarred closed. Then the tiny baby nests in the tube, and the mother has an ectopic pregnancy.
