THE PRO-LIFE MESSAGE IN A PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL

A pro-life club in a public high school? Why not? It's doable and it's legal. For the past seven years the ProVita Club has been functioning at John Adams High School in Queens.

It all began when I started wearing the precious feet pin to school. It drew students' attention and they began asking questions. Some of them would stop by after classes because they wanted to know more and we'd discuss the development of the baby and other questions they'd have about abortion. Finally, one of them suggested that they form a club.

A teacher may start a club that is curriculum related such as science or math, but other clubs must be student initiated. Here was a student actually asking to start a club. A statement of purpose was drawn up and submitted to the principal. The students would become educated about the life issues, especially abortion and euthanasia, and they would provide a service to the community. The proposal was then submitted

to the Office of the Queens Superintendent of High Schools and finally to the legal division of the Board of Education. Permission was granted to start the club.

Reading and discussing pro-life materials are integral parts of the club, but service projects are also very important. They help students put their beliefs into action and at the same time they give students a chance to share their beliefs with others. Over the years, the club has sponsored a number of fund raising activities for crisis pregnancy centers, made regular visits to a local nursing home and provided education for their fellow students through newsletters.

Our young people should hear the pro-life message at home from their parents and in the churches from their priests and ministers. Sometimes that doesn't happen, but it can happen in school if one teacher or one student wants to make it happen. It should be happening in the religious schools and it can happen in the public schools.

NEW YORK STATE

As of 7/13/01 all pro-life bills were still tied up in committee. Even this is not enough for pro-abortion advocates. Recently the National Abortion Rights Action League (NARAL) started a campaign against L.I. Senators who supported a conscience clause in the Senate version of the Women's Health and Wellness Bill. (Without this conscience clause religious organizations would be forced to provide insurance coverage for services which violate their moral teaching.) An ad, paid for by NARAL/NY announces: "Dinosaurs found on Long Island". With the heads of the nine Nassau and Suffolk State Senators (all Republican)—LaValle, Lack, Trunzo, Johnson, Balboni, Fuschillo, and Skelos-Marcellino, Hannon, superimposed on the bodies of dinosaurs, the ad declares: "They have blocked a bill to help women get mammograms'.

In truth the Senate version of the bill which includes insurance coverage for mammograms was supported by all nine Senators accused of blocking the coverage. NARAL plans on spending 40 million over the next four years in an attempt to intimidate pro-life legislators.

HEALTH & SCIENCE REPORT



THE FIELD OF STEM CELL RESEARCH

Do you support federal funding of stem cell research to help cure crippling diseases such as Parkinson's, Alzheimer's, Juvenile Diabetes, cancer, spinal cord injuries and heart attack damage? Who would say no to this polling question??? Now let's try the question this way – Would you support stem cell research to help cure crippling diseases if it involves the destruction of living human embryos? We think the poll results would be very different. In fact, in a national poll conducted in early June by International Communications Research, federal funding of stem cell research on live embryos that would be destroyed in their first week of development was opposed by a margin of 70% to 24%.

The media, at the present time, are just full of programming on the issue of federal funding of embryonic stem cell research. Notable people are coming out in favor of this ethically unacceptable and highly controversial research, and are condemning Christian Fundamentalists, Catholics and pro-lifers for "holding up" medical cures. It is unfortunate that because some researchers wish to obtain this funding, the truth that it is not necessary to harvest stem cells from human embryos, as other alternatives are available, is not emphasized. Scientists have the ability to obtain stem cells, called "adult cells", from bone marrow, brain tissue, fat (even from liposuction), blood, placentas, umbilical cord blood, and even cadavers. In fact, bone marrow transplants have been used for over 20 years for leukemia treatment. These hematopoietic cells are already used in cancer treatment.

Stem cells give rise to every component of the body. They are being hailed as the answer to all degenerative diseases. What new treatment has been used with success clinically on human patients? None!! Mice have been the laboratory success story, along with some baby chicks. Researchers predict the first practical use of laboratory-engineered tissue could come in five years. This research involves taking the stem cells from a human body, transferring them to the diseased, damaged, or dead tissue in a patient, where it would hopefully regenerate the affected tissue. No one knows yet what molecules are responsible for the ability of stem cells to differentiate into the many different tissues, how long these transformed cells will survive in these tissues, if they will become diseased, or whether they will sustain this new commitment. All these questions must be answered before cell-based therapy can be accepted as a viable medical treatment.

The moral and ethical controversy concerns the fact that researchers want to use the "leftover" donated embryos from in vitro fertilization. These live human embryos must be destroyed in order to obtain their stem cells. By using "adult" stem cells from the sources listed above, or the patient's own tissue, all moral, ethical and legal ramifications could be resolved. An added plus in using the patient's own cells is eliminating the risk of rejection of another person's tissue.

Arguments supporting the use of stored or "leftover" embryos are their availability, their proliferation, the potential to become any type of cell, and the fact that they will eventually be discarded anyway. Scientists at Anthrogenesis Corp., Cedar Knolls, NJ, developed the equivalent of embryonic stem cells from the placenta. These cells are called placental multipotent stem cells, because they can form different kinds of mature cells, such as cartilage, nerves, and the lining of blood vessels. Researchers in the United States and abroad have confirmed that "adult cells", like embryonic cells, may be more versatile than previously assumed. A Swedish team transformed adult neural stem cells into more than 10 different types of body tissue, including heart, lung, liver, and kidney cells.

The American Spectator quotes Kevin FitzGerald, Prof. of Medicine at Loyola University Medical Center: "If you look at some of the medical and scientific indications, adult stem cells are much closer to therapeutic applications; embryonic cells still have a variety of obstacles that need to be overcome." In this same article, Scott Gottlieb says, "...embryo cells can be a bit too flexible, differentiating into all kinds of tissue, both desirable and not...they grow into teratomas, tumors consisting of numerous tissue types, from gut, to skin to teeth. Injected adult stem cells are better behaved..." Of the 30 biotech firms, about 15 are involved in developing treatments using stem cells. Only 2 of these work with embryonic cells. It seems biotech companies are better listeners than our National Institutes of Health researchers. We must inform our legislators that Health by Death should never be our goal. Our tax dollars should never be used for research that destroys human life in order to cure others. All human life must be respected, no matter how small or at what stage in life's continuum.





ROTARY SEDUCED BY PLANNED PARENTHOOD'S "OVERPOPULATION" MYTH

Rotary International (RI), organized to provide humanitarian services, promote high ethical standards, goodwill and peace, has been seduced by International Planned Parenthood's efforts to create the appearance of "consensus" on the need for population control. (See RI News Release: Rotary, UNFPA to Cooperate on Population Development Issues). The United Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA) and Planned Parenthood met early this year to address "shared values" and concern for "overpopulation" and "reproductive health services".

UNFPA often downplays or disguises its role in marketing abortion as a critical component of its goal for "universal access to reproductive health services." RI knows better, but apparently does not see preborn children as entities to be protected. RI President Frank Devlyn has indicated that family planning may be included as part of the RI-UNFPA partnership depending on the cultural, ethnic, and religious values of the particular country. Mr. Devlyn is in for a rude awakening if he thinks such matters ever stopped UNFPA from pushing it's anti-life agenda. Shortly after the January 2001 earthquake in El Salvador, UNFPA shipped, not water or clothes, but "reproductive health kits" to this nation that has outlawed abortion. These kits were similar to those UNFPA sent to Kosovo refugees, which included condoms, emergency contraception, and IUDs. A Kosovo gynecologist admitted that UNFPA had offered him desperately needed medical equipment IF he would accept UNFPA contraceptives and support its reproductive health campaign in the war-ravaged region.

S.W. Mosher of the Population Research Institute points to the deception carried out by UNFPA and IPPF. "To mask (their) involvement and allay third world suspicions, population control aid is funneled through the UNFPA and NGO's (Non Governmental Organization), such as International Planned Parenthood (IPPF). For the same reason, strenuous efforts were made to create the appearance of international 'consensus' on the need for population control at the 1994 Cairo Conference on Population and Development. The 'surplus population' of the Third World must not suspect that it is being deliberately "reduced". Global population growth is slowing dramatically. Fertility rates are falling below

replacement. UN Population Division figures (show) 71 countries...almost half the world's population, now have below-replacement fertility rates." In a New York Times article, 11/17/96 "UN Reports World Is Less Crowded Than Expected", the United Nations survey found that the world's population is growing...more slowly than expected,...(and) the number of people being added to the world each year has begun to fall sooner than anticipated."

Despite these UN statistics, Rotary International will contribute to projects that promote education on population issues, access to family health care. AIDS awareness and prevention, hunger prevention, and projects to delay first births. The very premise of Rotary International's involvement in this Memorandum is in question. Despite UNFPA's alarms about overpopulation, the UN itself published a report in 1999 by its Population Division stating that more than 65 countries would have fertility rates at or below replacement levels in 2000. In fact, as governments have begun to recognize that depopulation within their borders are leading to economic collapse and the disappearance of their race, more than one are offering incentives for citizens to have MORE children. Furthermore, at least one of the causes behind the HIV/AIDS pandemic in Africa is the UN's promotion of condoms as a 'safer" way to deal with promiscuous and unsafe sex practices.

Rotarians should not be fooled by talk that the union with UNFPA is not "just' about abortion. Any connection promoting abortion, however small, is a bad one. And, anyway, why does Rotary need to be involved with an organization that holds abortion to be the right of any woman as young as 13? Pro-Life Rotarians should urge their local chapter to withhold dues to RI until it dissolves its partnership with UNFPA. Rotarians should see that funds raised locally stay local where their use can be monitored to help, not harm, those in need.



AVSC International (Access to Voluntary and Safe Contraception) formerly Association for Voluntary Sterilization; yet another 'progressive', sterilization as problem-solving' organization which primarily views humanity as cause for alarm. Incorporated in 1943 to promote worldwide male and female sterilization, AVSC received U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) funds in 1972 to organize its International Project. It spent \$15 million between 1985-1986 to promote sterilization and to train 'health' workers for this purpose in some sixty countries; 91% of these funds came directly from the U.S. government. Between 1972 and 1983 the association received \$69 million from USAID. Ever the fund-raiser for getting the world's poor to 'voluntarily' have themselves sterilized - by 1995, AVSC had an annual budget of more than \$24 million, and had offices in Bangladesh, India, Egypt, the Philippines, Mexico, and elsewhere throughout the developing world, as well as in Russia. AVSC also received funding from groups such as the UN Population Fund, the Turner Foundation, and the Sierra Club Foundation. Almost all of AVSC's 1995 budget was derived entirely from USAID; who's own budget in 1995 exceeded \$1,205,000,000! 


