Bus Shelter Signs Ordered Down

Our bus shelter signs, which debuted last spring, were suddenly taken down in mid-November. We were told that the Nassau County Planning Commission had ordered them removed after someone complained about them.

With the help of Hempstead Town Councilman, **Tony Santino**, we learned that the signs had been ordered down by a



low-level Planning Commission bureaucrat without the Commission Chairman's knowledge. At Tony's recommendation—citing First Amendment concerns—the Planning Commission reconsidered the removal order at its December meeting and reversed it, allowing the signs to be restored. Our thanks to Tony for his help and to the Nassau County Planning Commission for doing the right thing.

Though we have now assured our right to keep these effective signs in public view, they will come down again when our funding for them runs out. If you want to see the signs remain, please use the coupon on page 11 to contribute to our sign fund.

SAFE HAVENS FOR NEWBORN BABIES

Sadly, many young women abandon their newborn babies because they're afraid or don't know what else to do. To help prevent this, many states, including New York, have passed laws creating "safe havens": places where babies born to desperate mothers can be taken and cared for. Under these laws, a mother who can't take care of her baby for whatever reason may bring the baby within five days of birth to an approved site. No questions are asked as long as the baby isn't harmed. The mother will not be prosecuted for abandonment.

New York's law took effect in July 2000. It allows a mother who can't get help for a pregnancy to place her newborn in a location where the baby will be kept safe. The mother or father can reclaim the child within 15 months, after social workers have ensured that either parent is capable of caring for the child. The baby can be released for adoption within six months, after the mother has given up her parental rights.

The number of havens on Long Island are increasing, says Timothy Jaccard, president of the AMT Children of Hope Foundation in Mineola, which pushed for the law in New York. Jaccard says all hos-

pitals in Nassau and Suffolk are taking part in the program. Many fire stations, churches, high schools and other institutions in the metropolitan area are publicizing the program.

The foundation received about 3,000 calls last year. Jaccard says 49 of the calls were for "crisis" situations, in which the foundation had to intervene. Twelve babies were brought to safe havens. The goal is always to get newborns to hospitals quickly to ensure they get proper care. "Many of the babies are born prematurely and need to get care immediately," Jaccard says.

Safe havens provide an alternative to abortion. Jaccard says three women who were planning to have abortions decided to have their babies after becoming aware of the program. He says the safe haven program is only a final safety net for babies. The hope is that mothers will keep and care for their babies.

USE OF FEDERALLY CONTROLLED DRUGS IN PHYSICIAN ASSISTED SUICIDE MUST BE OPPOSED.

PRO-LIFE INSIGHTS:

Sample Letter:

Dear...: According to the latest statistics (1999) 38.2% of the 132,681 abortions in our state were Medicaid funded. This is many times the number of "medically necessary"

abortions which qualify for Medicaid under N.Y.S. Social Service Law 365a. Even more disturbing is the fact that statistics indicate half of the 10,345 abortion 5 performed on teenagers under 18 are Medicaid funded. Clearly, the state's unsupervised policy which violates our state law is unjust and illegal. Medicaid is a program intended to prevent illness and promote healing. Please vote to remove funding of abortion from the Medicaid Budget. Abortion is not health care. Thank you.

Sample Letter:

Dear...: The Family Protection Act (S.4836), which was introduced in the Senate on 4/17/01, requires Parental Consent before a girl under 18 is given an abortion and requires Informed Consent for women. The Family Protection Act is based on Pennsylvania legislation which was declared constitutional by the Supreme Court. In our state girls as young as 12 are given an abortion without parental knowledge. Abortionists are not required to give information to the pregnant woman. Pro-abortionists worship "choice", ignoring the fact that the innocent baby has no choice. But neither does the woman have a choice if she is denied information concerning the nature of her choice. Based on the decline of rate of abortion in Pennsylvania it is estimated that passage of this bill would save approximately 66 lives every day in our state. HEALTH & SCIENCE REPORT PRIMUM NON NOCERE-EUTHANASIA PART I

"The basic ethic of physicians down through the centuries has been consistent. Originated by a pagan physician, Hippocrates, 400 years before the time of Christ, that ethic was very clear. It was 'primum non nocere', meaning 'first do no harm'. That ethic passed into the Christian era and guided the medical profession until recent decades. It has been increasingly violated in these past years, as some physicians have returned to the pre-Hippocratic ethic which gave to physicians two roles—the one of curing but also the one of killing." (J.C.Willke, M.D.. Assisted Suicide & Euthanasia Past & Present) The word euthanasia comes from the Greek 'eus' (good) and 'thanatos' (death). Who could honestly look at the way euthanasia is practiced and call it a "good death" or a death with dignity? Webster defines euthanasia as: "1. Dying easily, quietly, and painlessly. 2. The act of willfully ending life in individuals with an incurable disease."

Besides the fact that doctors (and sometimes nurses) get to "play God" in this death practice, we see it is not the patient in most cases who voluntarily wills his or her life ended, but the doctor or authorities who make that decision. Most euthanized patients do not have an incurable disease! Withholding nutrition (food) and hydration (water) has become the norm as the merciful solution for people in their last days or in a coma. Since when has starvation and dehydration been considered comforting and painless? Euthanasia is administered in many ways, but as Dr. & Mrs. Willke say in their book, Why can't we love them both: "Qualifying euthanasia by calling it active or passive, direct or indirect, voluntary, nonvoluntary, involuntary, or assisted suicide only confuses the picture. Euthanasia Is When the Doctor Kills the Patient." Assisted suicide certainly is euthanasia, just disguised to promote social acceptance and sold as a merciful ministry. For that reason we would like to present a little history of the development of euthanasia through the years, as a warning and hopefully as a wake-up call!

In Germany, as far back as 1895, a medical textbook, much in use, promoted the "right-to-death". "Dying help" was to be considered a merciful solution and was supported by the medical and legal profession in Germany that was touted as the most advanced medical community in the world. A publication, Permitting the Destruction of Unworthy Life by Professors Binding and Hoche, influenced the acceptance of euthanasia. This publication generated debates, and the concept of legal medical killing was rejected in 1921 at a German medical convention. Critics cited a 1914 book, written by Dr. M. Beers: "physician aid in dying might be the first step, but whether it would be the last appears to me to be very doubtful...Once respect for the sanctity of human life has been diminished by introducing voluntary mercy killing for the mentally-healthy incurably ill, and involuntary killing for the mentally ill, who is going to ensure that matters stop there." Euthanasia was accepted in Germany long before Hitler's reign and the infamous holocaust of World War II. "By 1945, 250,000 men, women and

children had been killed under the euphemisms of 'help for the dying' and 'mercy killing'...The hospital at Hadamar became perhaps the most notorious of the killing centers...cited...as a model of the ethical tragedy of German medicine...Hadamar drifted from a hospital to a human slaughterhouse...The stories of the medical experiments at Dachau, Auschwitz and the other centers of death are the stuff of nightmares...By the war's end, the death camp had become a monument to medicine without morals and without limits." (Charles J. Sykes, Medical Nightmares: German Doctors/American Doctors)

The excuses were the same then as they are now with abortion and embryonic research, that all victims were to die anyway! Surely no one would ever want to repeat this historical medical travesty! Unfortunately, history tends to repeat itself.

Dr. & Mrs. Willke point out that in 1981, "Holland was the first modern nation to legalize euthanasia...130,000 people die each year in Holland, and over 20,000 are killed, directly or indirectly, by doctors. As many as half did not ask to be killed...When asked whether they approved of euthanasia, senior citizens, healthy and living in the economy, agreed by 50%. When the same question was asked of residents of nursing homes, only 3% approved." A 1990 report states that 1,000 of the 25,306 euthanasia deaths were cases of active, involuntary euthanasia, usually by a single, lethal injection. 4,941 cases involved "morphine...gradually given in increasingly excessive doses with the intent to terminate life...done without the patient's consent... The report adds that there were also other cases, not listed, involving euthanasia of newborns with disabilities and children with life-threatening diseases." To protect seniors and others hospitalized, several groups have emerged to prevent doctors from killing. Courts have set up guidelines, but they are ignored, and doctors are not prosecuted for non-observance. Physicians are given complete authorization in euthanasia decisions. According to Brian Clowes, Ph.D. in *The Facts of Life*: "Eighty percent of Dutch doctors have killed people deliberately through direct, active (not passive) euthanasia. A 1991 government survey found that only one in ten Dutch doctors would refuse a request for euthanasia...Physicians often perform involuntary euthanasia on patients who have chronic diabetes, rheumatism, multiple sclerosis, AIDS or bronchitis, and upon older accident victims, regardless of the prognosis... Many Dutch citizens, in selfdefense, now carry a 'Declaration of a Will to Live'...which states that they do not want to be euthanized without their knowledge. These documents are also called Life Passports or 'Don't Kill Me' cards...these Declarations carry very little weight with the same doctors who introduced—and then ignored—the so-called 'Living Wills' in Holland." Could the euthanasia movement have become so powerful without the commitment of doctors? We think not!

In 1995 the Northern Territory in Australia became the second modern nation to pass legislation to legalize euthanasia. Debates were held from 1995 to 1997 over this legislation, led by the Australian Medical Association and were efficacious in persuading the Parliament to reverse the law.

A Poll of the Polls Fr. Frank Payone/Priests for Life

Professor Raymond J. Adamek (Department of Sociology, Kent State University) has done the pro-life movement a great service in his study "Abortion Polls 1965-1998: Designed to Measure or to Mold Public Opinion?" His analysis of major opinion polls on the abortion question during that time frame reveals that, given the way the questions are asked, what is being measured is not the public's opinion about the current abortion laws and practice. What is being measured is their opinion about imaginary abortion laws and practice. This is simply because so many of the questions misrepresent the facts.

Professor Adamek explains, "On 85 occasions from 1973 to 1998, 8 major pollsters described Roe v. Wade as permitting abortion during 'the first three months of pregnancy' ... [T] his description is incomplete and misleading, since it gives the uninformed respondent the impression that the Court did not legalize abortion beyond the first trimester, and focuses the attention of the informed respondent on only part of the decision." A reading of Roe and subsequent abortion decisions, a study of the legislation and Court battles on partial-birth abortion, or a journey through the "A" section of the Yellow Pages of a major city is enough to dispel any doubts that abortion is legal throughout pregnancy. So why can't a poll that wants to measure what people think about that policy ask people what they think about that policy, instead of what they think about some different policy? The conclusion: You simply can't believe a poll that tells you that most Americans agree with "Roe vs. Wade." They still don't know what the decision said, and it is most likely that the pollster hasn't helped them find out.

"Choose Life" License Plates Upheld in Florida, Delayed in South Carolina:

Florida's "Choose Life" license plates will continue to be sold, as a circuit court judge dismissed a pro-abortion lawsuit that claimed the plates were unconstitutional. However, in South Carolina, the license plates will not be available until a Planned Parenthood lawsuit is heard next year. Since the (Florida) plates went on sale in August 2000, over 25, 000 have been sold, according to the Associated Press (AP). The money generated from their sale, about \$668,000 so far, will go to organizations that promote and assist in adoptions. Gov. Jeb Bush's press secretary, Elizabeth Hirst, praised Judge Nikki Ann Clark's decision to dismiss the plaintiff's suit. "We have always believed this suit had no legal merit," she told the AP. "People make a personal choice to display the Choose Life license plate. It is their right as an individual." Source NRTL News 12/01

A.G. SPITZER ATTACKS CRISIS-PREGNANCY CENTERS

During the first 10 days of the new year New York State Attorney General Eliot Spitzer served subpoenas on three downstate pregnancy assistance centers including the Life Center of Long Island. Subpoenas to other N.Y.S. centers are expected soon. These subpoenas demand the production—by February 1st—of all documents and materials used by these volunteer help centers for the last three years in an attempt to prove that they have engaged in "... false advertising and deceptive business practices ... practicing medicine without a license. ... and other fraudulent of illegal acts . . ."

This is clearly a fishing expedition in which Spitzer is abusing the power and resources of his office to satisfy the agenda of the National Abortion and Reproductive Rights Action League (NARAL) which wants these women-supportive and baby-saving centers out of business. NARAL recognizes that crisis pregnancy centers are effective in taking business away from abortionists, convincing mothers that life is clearly a better choice than death for them and their babies. Spitzer is serving as their taxpayer-paid thug to stamp out that competition. Even if he doesn't prove a thing against the centers, as is likely, he will tie them up in legal proceedings for years. Their meager resources will have to be spent defending their existence instead of helping women and babies.

Chris Slattery, of Expectant Mother Care in New York City, is organizing a legal and public relations response to Spitzer's subpoenas. Both he and the Life Center will need your prayers and support as they counter this latest attack by agents of the culture of death. 





Northern State- Exit 35 South- Follow the same Route as the Expressway.

Southern State-Exit 27 North to Wantagh State Pkwy Exit W3 under bridge. Keep left and follow Service Road to Newbridge Rd. (Service Road merges with Newbridge Rd.) North to Fordham Ave. Turn Right at signal light.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

QUESTION: Is there treatment for Post Abortion Syndrome?

ANSWER: Yes, but it is not easy. We first must note that only a few doctors are sensitized to the necessary dynamics of treatment. Specifically, most psychiatrists and psychologists aren't much help, nor are psychotropic drugs. This requires a gradual healing process, and during it she must have ongoing close emotional support from one or several people who do not have to be trained professionals.

As of the late 1990's, the place to start is your pro-life pregnancy help center. They can either work with her themselves and/ or will know who can. Basically, there are five steps to the healing process: (1) Counter the denial. (2) She must grieve over her lost child—tears, mourning as for another loved one. (3) Seek Divine forgiveness. (4) Forgive others. (5) Forgive herself. Not many get this far, but those who do have real inner peace.

What is absolutely crucial at every step in the above is compassionate empathy, support and understanding from one or more persons around her.
