PLANNED PARENTHOOD ADOPTION REFERRALS DWINDLING

Most pro-lifers think nothing of using the terms "pro-abortion" or "anti-life" when describing our opponents. After all, if you aren't fighting for life, it's not hard to figure out what you're pushing instead.

Wrong, our opponents cry: "We're about 'choice." Theoretically, it makes no difference to them whether a woman decides to have an abortion or not. So long as it's left up to the mother- -or, pregnant woman - -it's a good decision.

Indeed, we have it on the good authority of Planned Parenthood- - "the world's oldest, largest, and most trusted volunteer, not-for-profit reproductive health care organization," its website says. What they do, a spokesman say, is "let women know their options and trust they will make the best decision for themselves."

I'm sure that few readers will be surprised to learn that the number of abortions outweighs the number of adoptions, but you may not know how bad it is: Planned Parenthood's own numbers show that in 2000, about 98 percent of its clients rejected life, resulting in more than 197,000 abortions. By contrast, there were only 2,486 adoptions referrals chairman of the Ad Hoc Committee in Defense of Life. McFadden at the HLR, which he had founded in 1975. She, her mother Faith Abbott McFadden and their staff also run the other organizations founded and chaired by the late Mr. McFadden: the Ad Hoc Committee, an anti-abortion lobbying organization, and the National Committee of Catholic Laymen, which publishes the monthly newsletter Catholic Eye. Maria and her husband Robert Maffucci live in Manhattan and have three children.

It's not hard to guess why abortions far outpace adoptions at Planned Parenthood: Money. Conservative News Services estimates that, using an average cost of \$350 per abortion (the Washington, D.C., affiliate of Planned Parenthood says that price of an abortion for a woman who is no more than 12 weeks pregnant is \$325). Planned Parenthood earned more than \$69 million from abortions in 2000.

Hey, pro-abort pregnancy counselors may reply, that's just the way it works out. We can't help it if so many decide to abort. Ah, but they can: by making pregnant women under duress feel that abortion is their only real choice.

Why are so few babies put up each year for adoption? There are many factors at work (such as the loss of any social stigma surrounding unwed motherhood). But one reason is that too few pregnant women are given reliable, complete information on adoption- - if they're even made aware that it's an option in the first place.

Remember that the next time a pro-abort tells you he's pushing "choice." Tell him the odds are against it- -80 to 1, to be exact.

FEDERAL LEGISLATION

VOTE ON PARTIAL-BIRTH ABORTION BAN EXPECTED IN THE U.S. SENATE.

It was reassuring for the pro-life cause that the ban on Partial-Birth Abortion (PBA) was passed by the overwhelming vote of 274-151 on 7/24/02. The disappointing note was the partisan vote that saw only 65 Democrats supporting the ban while 141 Democrats opposed it. You certainly wonder where is the mindset of those who openly supported such a heinous procedure on infants just about ready to be born. Fortunately, Republicans helped to successfully pass the ban by a vote of 208-9.

Regretfully, of the 31 Representatives from New York State in the U.S. Congress, only 3 of the 19 Democrats supported the ban whereas 10 of the 12 Republicans supported the ban.

PRESIDENT BUSH SIGNS THE BORN ALIVE INFANTS PROTECTION ACT.

On 8/5/02 the President had this to say: "I sign this important legislation (which) ensures that every infant born alive—including an infant who survives an abortion procedure—is considered a person under federal law....It is a step toward the day when the promises of the Declaration of Independence will apply to everyone, not just those with the voice and power to defend their rights.... This law is a step toward the day when America fully becomes, in the words of Pope John Paul II, 'a hospitable, a welcoming culture.""

MEETING WITH 2nd C.D. CONGRESSMAN STEVE ISRAEL PROVES DISSAPOINTING.

As was his vote to continue with Partial-Birth Abortions, Representative Israel made it clear that he supports a woman's right to choose. We left him with pro-life material, including an article from the *National Right to Life News* on PBA which he said he would read.

BEWARE—THE CONVENTION TO ELIMINATE DISCRIMINATION AGAINST WOMEN (CEDAW, pronounced SEE-daw)

On 7/30/02, the Senate Foreign Relations Committee voted 12-7 to recommend that the full Senate ratify a treaty known as CEDAW. A vote by the full Senate could come at any time. Though the treaty does not even contain the word abortion, the treaty obligates ratifying nations to insure equal access to health care services including those related to family planning. This has been interpreted by various official bodies to condemn any type of restriction on the grounds that any restrictions on abortion are by definition discrimination against women.

ACTION: Contact U.S. Senators urging they not approve CEDAW.

NORPLANT TO BE DISCONTINUED

On 7/26, Wyeth announced it would no longer distribute or market the Norplant System which provides "contraception" for five years. (Actually, Norplant can also cause early abortions by sometimes allowing conception to occur but then preventing the embryo from implanting in the uterus.) The Norplant System, plagued with problems since its introduction in 1990, settled out of court with 36,000 women for more than \$54 million in 1999 for side effects of Norplant. Norplant has agreed to pay for all removals until 12/31/02. Call Norplant at 800-364-9809. THE NEW SLAVERY

For some time now, we have been saying that the destruction of human beings, at any stage of development, is not only a moral issue but also a civil rights issue. The horrors of fetal experimentation and research funded by well-known foundations have often been compared to the abominable. medical practices during the holocaust. Abortion (Roe v Wade, Doe v Bolton-1973 Supreme Court decisions) and slavery (Dred Scott-1857 Supreme Court decision) have been compared because both the unborn and slaves were considered non-persons; property that could legally be kept or killed, bought or sold. We can now add "left-over" embryos and cloned human beings to these comparisons! Syndicated columnist Cal Thomas has "also compared the pro-life battle to the anti-slavery movement, saying, 'We are in the early stages of a great horror, and we may not live to see it resolved."" (The Long Island Catholic)

"John F. Kilner, Pres. of The Center for Bioethics and Human Dignity said, 'The possible patenting of human beings, no matter their age, size or stage of existence, would be a crushing blow (to) essential human rights and dignity.' Since 1987, the Patent Office has held that patents would not be allowed on human beings because of 'conflicts' with the 13th Amendment prohibition of slavery." (The Catholic Chronicle -Pro Life Infonet) Well, the "blow" has been delivered: "The U.S. Patent and Trademark Office, early last month, (May '02) granted a broad patent on cloning technology used to clone mammals - including humans - to the University of Missouri...The university shares its financial interest in the patent with Biotransplants, Inc., a Massachusetts-based biotech company." (The Catholic Chronicle) We guess therapeutic possibilities overcome the 13th Amendment slavery implications! They can use the double-speak of Sen. Hillary Clinton: "I oppose the cloning of human beings. I believe that human cloning is unsafe, and ethically dangerous. However, in our effort to ban human cloning, we must be sure not to impede the important medical research being done in our nation's laboratories ... " The legislation she supports sounds great at face value-Human Cloning Prohibition Act. Although it would prohibit Reproductive Cloning (development of a cloned embryo to birth), the legislation Sen. Clinton supports allows cloning of human embryos for research. In her letter she states, "I believe this bill strikes the right balance between regulating human cloning and preserving fields of research that have the potential to save lives and alleviate the suffering of millions of Americans." We would like to add-at the expense of embryonic life! Please note - the Act is not a total ban, but a "regulating" of human cloning. The bill Clinton supports "permits the cloning of human embryos and the establishment of human embryo farms." (Life News)

At the present time, federal funding for human embryo research is banned. Legislation that would ban privately funded research is needed! Senators Brownback and Landrieu's bill, S.1899, would ban all forms of human cloning. We must do all we can to gain support for this bill. President Bush favors a total ban on all human cloning: "Human cloning is an enormously troubling development in biotechnology. It is unethical in itself and dangerous as a precedent." Germany and Spain have already banned cloning for any purpose. (Life News)

New York Times, July 23, 2002, Nicholas D. Kristof. "In a secret, locked barn near De Forest [Wisconsin], five black-andwhite calves look up from their hay with huge friendly eyes...all five are part human. The five calves are clones, which is eerie enough. In addition, human DNA was added to their genetic makeup when they were embryos...These humanoid calves offer a window into a future in which lines are blurred between humans and other species. Biotechnology is transforming the world around us, far more quickly than we can build a regulatory structure to accommodate it...Francis Fukuyama, in his brilliant new book on cloning, *Our Post-Human Future*, warns that we could face a future 'in which any notion of shared humanity is lost, because we have mixed human genes with those of so many other species that we no longer have a clear idea of what a human being is."

President Bush's Council on Bioethics recommended outlawing human cloning for reproduction and at least a 4-year moratorium on human cloning for biomedical research. This would provide more time for scientific evidence to be gathered, and to see if other morally non-problematic approaches might be available. Ken Connor, Pres., Family Research Council, favors funding of "alternative and ethical avenues of research" which could lead to medical cures. (*The Long Island Catholic*)

In Ottawa, Canada, doctors have used **adult** stem cells from bone marrow to treat four patients with multiple sclerosis. Six months later, the first patient was found to have no evidence of M.S. on MRI scans. The other three cases followed with similar results. Dr. Catherine Verfaille, University of Minnesota Stem Cell Institute, coaxed stem cells from **adult** bone marrow to transform into functioning liver-like cells that passed tests for 7 different liver functions. Note, these were adult stem cells, not embryonic cells. The journal "Nature Technology" reports that scientists from Norway and the US transformed ordinary skin cells into T cells, which are the key immune system cells. "It shows that tissue can be generated from adult cells without the need to destroy embryos..." (RTL of Greater Cincinnati, Inc.)

On "Connie Chung Tonight" (CNN, 8/12/02, 'First Cloned Human Being'), the future parents of the first cloned baby targeted to be born in 2003 were asked, in relation to the many serious problems cloned animals have, what they would do if their baby was found to have problems in utero. The mother-tobe replied, "We'll abort!" She then tried to justify her response by saying "We'll give the stem cells from the fetus to help someone...If God didn't want us to do this, then He wouldn't make it possible to do this!"

John F. Kilner states, "What is slavery other than one person owning another? By giving a company ownership of human beings produced through a cloning process, this patent apparently gives government approval to a new form of slavery...Human beings are not property." Has eugenics been given a commercial license?

John Mawn, RIP

A deluge of memories, accumulated over more than 30 years of pro-life activism, flooded forth last Sunday when news came of the death of John Mawn.

There was virtually no area of pro-life work in which John was not involved, and no major pro-life initiative here on Long Island — indeed, few throughout the country — for which John Mawn did not give tirelessly of himself.

He was there when New York first legalized abor-

tion-on-demand in 1970, giving pro-life talks and training others to do so; organizing lobbying trips to Albany; helping coordinate public demonstrations; and playing a key role in persuading the New York Legislature to reverse itself just two years later, only to be thwarted by Gov. Rockefeller's veto.

Following the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision of January 22, 1973, he redoubled his efforts here on Long Island, and reached out nationally, helping organize other states as well. He was among the earliest organizers of the annual

March for Life in Washington, D.C. He was particularly gifted in raising funds, a talent he put to work to help get pro-life commercials on television throughout New York State in 1974, and to help launch Ellen McCormack's prolife Presidential campaign in the 1976 Democratic primaries.

His involvement never waned over more than 30 years. A recipient, along with his wife Marie, of our diocesan Pro-Vita Award in 1996, he was actively involved in numerous diocesan pro-life projects, including our monthly processions for life. When he saw a need in the pro-life movement he acted to meet it, something that led him in recent years to form Elect Life, a pro-life political action committee.

Yet with all that he did — and the list is endless — John Mawn's greatest contributions to the pro-life cause, in my view, were not so much what he did as how he did it.

No one was more grieved by the mass destruction of pre-born babies, and John gave no quarter in fighting to defend innocent life. I will always remember the day late in 1972 when Gov. Rockefeller came to Long Island for a town meeting. After one or two questions about abortion, the Governor declared that it was time to move to another topic. Spotting a man with a fireman's badge, he quieted the crowd by announcing, "Let a fireman talk." "Governor," came a familiar voice, "as a fireman I'm concerned with protecting life; and I think your abortion law makes a mockery of what we as firemen do, because it destroys life." John Mawn, volunteer firefighter, had had his say; and he had outwitted that master politician, Nelson Rockefeller, who was reduced to banging an ashtray in anger, shouting, "That's enough about abortion!"



Along with his fervent zeal, however, John Mawn brought to his pro-life work an unbounded joy, born of his own zest for life, and his unshakeable faith in God. He loved a good laugh, a party, fellowship with friends, and he put just as much energy into enjoying life as he did into defending life. This enabled him to see the pro-life cause as an opportunity to joyfully do God's work. It made him a more effective advocate, and it helped him avoid the despair that has afflicted some in the movement, and the anger that has factionalized others.

To be sure, John was outspoken in voicing his own strong opinions about various pro-life strategies; but he could argue forcefully with you at a meeting, then have a beer and friendly conversation with you afterward; disagree with one approach of a pro-life group, then be found actively assisting them in another endeavor that he found worthwhile. He would do whatever he felt was in the best interests of the unborn; and he never, ever questioned the pro-life commitment of those whose strategies differed from his.

With all his involvements — pro-life, Knights of Columbus, volunteer fire department, and a host of other community and civic activities — John Mawn was first and foremost a family man. His wife Marie has been every bit as committed as he to the pro-life cause, and virtually all they have done they have done as a team. They recognized the value of strong families in promoting respect for life, so they founded Families for Life, which has always been the cornerstone of their pro-life efforts. They raised five children, all adults now, and John told me recently how proud and thankful he was that all of his children are faithful Catholics and committed prolifers.

In all his civic and pro-life activities, John Mawn responded well to the call of Vatican II for Catholics to engage the modern world. Through service to others and advocacy for life, he worked to apply Catholic social teaching to the issues of our time.

Some years ago, Congressman Henry Hyde offered a moving reflection on the final judgement, when we are "there alone standing before God."

"I really believe that those in the pro-life movement will not be alone," he said. "I think there will be a chorus of voices that have never been heard in this world but are heard very beautifully and very loudly in the next world, and I think they will plead for everyone who has been in the movement. They will say to God, 'Spare them, because they loved us;' and God will look at us and say, not 'Did you succeed?' but 'Did you try?'"

No one tried harder than John Mawn.

 Encouraging letter-writing, phone calls and other contacts with candidates and elected officials about issues
- Inviting all candidates for public office to a church sponsored public forum, debate, or candidates' night
- Conducting a non-partisan voter registration drive on church property
- Distributing unbiased candidate questionnaires or voting records on a wide variety of issues

Prohibited Church Activities

- Endorsing/opposing candidates for political office
- Homilies/bulletin inserts regarding specific candidates
- Distributing or permitting distribution of partisan campaign literature under church auspices or on church property
- Arranging for groups to work for a candidate for public office
- Funding or financially supporting any candidate, political action committee, or political party
- Inviting only selected candidates to address your church-sponsored group or permitting/hosting political meetings on church property
- Conducting voter registration that is slanted toward one party
