### FEDERAL LEGISLATION



#### AUSCHWITZ vs. USA

Much has been written about the Nazi concentration camps of WWII. A recent visit to the Auschwitz Camp in Poland helped to confirm all the revulsion and horror I previously had regarding them. Auschwitz stood on a flat plain of thousands of acres with its own railroad station in which Jews or Polish political prisoners were transported to in boxcars. Ironically, some victims had purchased railroad tickets to the camp believing that a better life awaited them there compared to the heavily patrolled, and overcrowded bob-wired Warsaw ghetto where most came from. Upon arrival at Auschwitz Secret Service guards directed victims to the left or the right. Those that were destined for immediate death were sent to the showers where instead of water streaming out, Zyklon B gas blew out causing a very painful and horrible death within minutes. Most disturbing to me was the sight of steel railroad tracks that were used to cart the dead bodies from the gas chambers to the huge furnaces where their lifeless bodies were turned into ash. Other sights that touched most visitors were the huge glass enclosures that contained the prosthesis of the handicapped, the prescription glasses, bales of human hair, suitcases with their owners' names written on them. All evidence that was shocking and revealing. The phrase, "man's inhumanity to man", kept going through my mind. How could this holocaust ever have occurred due to one's race or religion? One consoling factor concerning these horrible deeds is that by June of 1945 there would not be any more victims to this totalitarian atrocity....

Unfortunately, what the USA has legalized and endorsed by means of the U.S. Supreme Court's Roe vs. Wade decision is as heinous in effect as were the concentration camps. In the 30 years since January 22, 1973 over 45 million innocent unborn babies' lives have been destroyed under the mantra of pro-choice. Using a numeric comparison, the lives decimated by the insidious act of abortion now out- number by 8 to 1 those deaths of our elder brothers, the Jews during WWII.

The fate of innocent preborn babies lives continues to be unprotected. It is indeed consoling to say that the holocaust of WWII is ended and that the suffering and deaths have stopped. However, it is painful knowing that the holocaust of innocent unborn babies continues. Most people were not aware of the plight of those in concentration camps until war's end. Thus little was done on their behalf. However, because of what we know regarding the plight of the innocent unborn it is essential that everyone of us help in their behalf. God will certainly help those who attempt to help the unborn.

#### **UNBORN VICTIMS OF VIOLENCE**

A double murder charge has been filed against Scott Peterson in the death of his pregnant wife Laci Peterson and their unborn son Conner. Had this case come before a New York State Court, Scott would only have been charged with his wife's murder. Twenty-six states have various statutes which protect fetal life from deliberate destruction. California has such laws, New York has none. A typical example of New York's failure to protect fetal life is the Joy Schepes case. Dr. Stephen Pack, a married Bronx physician, attempted to destroy the fetus of his girlfriend by injecting her with an abortion inducing drug. Fortunately, his attempt was unsuccessful but had it been, he would not have been charged for the death of the unborn child.

#### **HEALTH & SCIENCE REPORT**

#### **OVERPOPULATION—MYTH OR REALITY?**



"Unless we have a big increase in the death rate, all of the projections, even the most optimistic, show us adding another 2.5 billion people... It is slowing, but we are already in a situation of near disaster...famines of unbelievable proportions...hundreds of millions of people starving to death...a genuine age of scarcity." (Paul Ehrlich, author of The Population Bomb, 1968) In response, Steven Mosher, president of the Population Research Institute, summarized the findings of Professor Julian Simon: "As our numbers have climbed so has our well-being. In 1800, when there were only 1 billion people, per-capita income was a mere \$100. By 1900, as the population was closing in on 2 billion, it reached \$500. Currently, with 6 billion people, per capita income has soared to \$5,000. In 2100, when the population will be between 7 billion and 8 billion-and falling-it will be \$30,000 in current dollars. Driving the so-called 'population explosion' has been a real explosion in health and longevity. As late as the 19<sup>th</sup> century, four of every 10 children died before reaching the age 5. Today the mortality rate for children younger than 5 is less than 7 percent. Two hundred years ago, human life expectancy was less than 30 years; today it is more than 65 years."

Professor Simon wrote that technology is responsible for improving life-more people find more solutions to problems. He states that with the increase in population, raw materials and energy have become less scarce, the world food supply has grown, and pollution in the US has gone down. Simon wrote that the population has increased at different rates throughout history, but no matter how it increases, food increases as fast as or faster than population. In Simon's posthumous publication, Hoodwinking the Nation, Simon states that there is a "funding incentive for scholars and institutions to produce bad news about population, resources and the environment." For example, the U.S. Agency for International Development and the U.N. Fund for Population Activities spend more than \$100 million a year in the effort to stop population growth. "Much of this money goes to studies and publications that show why fertility decline is a good thing." One of Ehrlich's recommendations is to dump chemicals in the water supply to control population!

Brian Clowes, author of *The Facts of Life*, writes "the push (of the pro-abortion movement) for easy access to contraception was a cover for abortion agitation in North America and Europe in the past and in developing countries all over the world today." Dr. Alan Guttmacher of the International Planned Parenthood Federation stated, "Each country will have to decide its own form of coercion and determine when and how it should be employed. At present, the means available are compulsory sterilization and compulsory abortion. Perhaps someday a way of enforcing compulsory birth control will be feasible." Article 15 of Humanist Manifesto II declares, "It is the moral obligation of the developed nations to provide...birth control techniques to the developing portions of the globe." The founder of NARRAL (National Abortion and Reproductive Rights Action League), Lawrence Lader said, "The right to abortion, an inalienable right of all women, is an integral part of population control." Molly Yard, former president of the National Organization for Women stated, "The abortion question is not just about women's rights, but about life on the planet – environmental catastrophe awaits the world if population continues to grow at its present rate." Ingrid Newkirk, founder of People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals stated, "(humans) have grown like a cancer. We're the biggest blight on the face of the earth."

Julian Simon wrote, "The world's problem is not too many people, but lack of political and economic freedom. Blaming population for poor countries' problems is a tragic intellectual error." Max Singer of the Hudson Institute states, "...many people fear that it (population) will keep "exploding" until there are too many people for the earth to support. But that is like fearing your baby will grow to 1,000 pounds because its weight doubles three times in its first seven years." Some facts from Dr. Jacqueline R. Kasun: "If you allotted 1250 square feet to each person, all the people in the world would fit into the state of Texas ... the population density of this giant city would be about 21,000-somewhat more that San Francisco and less than the Bronx ... World population growth is rapidly declining. United Nations figures show that the 79 countries that comprise 40 percent of the world's population now have fertility rates too low to prevent population decline."

Professor Antonio Fazio, governor of the Bank of Italy stated, "... in Europe in general, and in Italy in particular, couples have an average of 1.3 children...Unless couples return to having at least two children, in 20-30 years time the deficit of births will have repercussions on economic and social development...a great number of Europe's paralysis stem from the aging and decrease in number of the inhabitants, a phenomenon that spells the aging of the mechanisms for economic development...we need a young population, and investment in its education and training, because knowledge leads to development." Eamonn Keane writes, "Poverty and underdevelopment has no direct link to population growth per se. The causes of underdevelopment...may include poor political and economic administration, widespread corruption, excessive military budgets combined with inadequate spending on health and education, fratricidal wars, defective markets, entrepreneurial freedom erroneously understood as the right to unbridled pursuit of profit...less developed nations can be the victims of inequitable distribution of ... resources as well as international and financial arrangements which work against them...they are often overburdened by foreign debt and unable to gain affordable access to the technology they need to further the development process. Problems such as these can only be eradicated through the pursuit of social justice which will enable integral development to occur."

# QUESTIONS & ANSWERS



Terri Schiavo, 39, was brain damaged by lack of oxygen after a heart attack in 1990. Her nourishment has been by feeding tube. A court battle between her husband, who wants the tube removed

to let her die, and her parents and family, who want it continued so she will live, has lasted five years. Her parents' physicians say she recognizes and responds to her parents and would benefit by rehabilitation care. On June 6, 2003 an appeals court ruled to have her feeding tube removed, so Terri will die.

#### What's wrong with "letting Terri die"? This is not letting die—this is killing. We all need food and water to live; removing them kills us. Some disabled people cannot swallow or feed themselves. Feeding tubes (directly into the stomach) are an effective, painless way to give this basic, ordinary care. Unless patients are imminently dying or cannot assimilate (metabolize) food, traditional medical ethics says this basic care must be provided. But a new "quality of life" ethic is changing the "rules." Now judges and courts

decide whose life is worth living.
