Dear Defender of Life,

I'll get right to the point. We need your help. If you're like me you could be suffering from "giving fatigue" with all the natural disasters in this country and abroad prompting appeals to our generosity. You, our generous contributors, are undoubtedly spread thin trying to help the less fortunate around the world. Like many organizations dependent on voluntary donations we have seen a resultant decline in contributions.

We have been asked, "Why are there so many pro-life groups seeking contributions?" The answer is straightforward: different groups do different jobs within the pro-life movement. Some work within a particular religious denomination, some counsel and support women, some are purely educational, some focus on political action and/or lobbying, some are legal organizations to fight in the courts, some are geographic, working in a specific state or local area. By focusing on one aspect of the pro-life battle or working within a particular geographic area, each can maintain flexibility and can muster the specialized expertise or local familiarity needed to do the job well. Our niche in the pro-life effort is Long Island.

Your Long Island Coalition for Life, comprised of 59 local pro-life groups, is the umbrella organization for Long Island. In conjunction with our member groups we engage in a full range of pro-life activities. Though we are an affiliate of the New York State Right to Life Committee, which itself is a chapter of the National Right to Life Committee, we receive no funding from them. We derive the bulk of our funds from—and focus our activity on—Long Island. Without the support of pro-life Long Islanders we could not keep up the life-affirming work we do here on Long Island.

An example of what we do is the two-sided, 10 x 22 foot mobile billboard, pictured here, which made multiple passes at our Stand up For Life event in Huntington on October 2nd. Traversing busy highways, it traveled Long Island from Great Neck on the Queens border to Southampton on the east end for 20 days during the month of October. We made a point to route it past colleges, high schools, shopping malls, busy railroad stations and local fairs. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, tens of thousands of Long Islanders saw a powerful pro-life message.

FEDERAL LEGISLATION NEW JUSTICES ON THE COURT

In 1789 Congress passed the Judiciary Act calling for one Chief Justice, John Jay, and five associate justices (since increased to eight).



One of the U.S. Supreme Court's major duties is to see that the Executive and the Legislative branches abide by the dictates of the Constitution. However, the Constitution imposes on the Supreme Court the responsibility not to usurp the power of the Executive or the Legislative branches. Serious violations of these principles occurred in both the 1857 Dred Scott and the 1973 Roe v Wade and Roe v Bolton decisions.

In Dred Scott, Justice Roger Tanney ruled because a slave was not a citizen that slave could not bring forth a suit for freedom in the nation's courts. The Supreme Court also ruled that the Constitution considered slaves the property of their owner and under the owner's total dominion.

These erroneous judgments of the High Court resulted in the Civil War causing over one-half million deaths and the keeping of over 4 million slaves in bondage until near the end of the Civil War.

Roe v Wade and Doe v Bolton, 1/22/73, reveal the error of the Supreme Court usurping the legislative power of Congress whose duty is to make laws. By its 7-2 decision it legalized the killing of the innocent unborn. Since 1973 over 45 million babies have suffered the excruciatingly painful death of abortion.

With the recent appointment of Judge John Roberts to replace deceased Chief Justice William Rehnquist and the possible appointment of Judge Samuel Alito to replace retiring Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, we feel confident the Executive, the Legislative and the Judicial bodies will seek to do away with the slaughter of our babies. Currently, the likely makeup of the Supreme Court will be 5 pro-abortion to 4 pro-life justices. The appointment of one more pro-life justice would swing the majority of the pro-life justices in our favor 5-4. Keep praying and working to overthrow Roe v Wade.

STEM CELL FUNDING RESEARCH

Senator Majority Leader Bill Frist reports that the Stem Cell Research bill, despite its momentum earlier this year, will not get a vote in 2005 but he agreed to make it a priority in 2006. The bill sagged because the Senate could not agree on how to debate several alternatives.

NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATION



The N.Y.S. Legislature is in recess

until January, but could be called back to vote in Special Session at any time.

Ask your state legislators to SUPPORT the "Human Cloning Act (S.2400/A.4855), the only true ban on human

cloning bill currently before the state legislature; and, to **OPPOSE S.433.A, A.6300** and any other bill which provides funding for cloning or embryonic stem cell research (see 10/05 *Life News*).

The FAMILY HEALTH CARE DECISIONS ACT (revised 6/21/05) should be strongly opposed. Expect this legislation to be acted on in 12/05 or in the 2006 Session. A "quality of life" ethic has been permeating the medical culture. Patients who want to live have to demonstrate their value in this new culture. Certain persons are deemed less worthy of receiving life-saving care. The question changes from "how" one it treated to "who" gets treatment. The tragic ordeal and death of Terri Schiavo exposed the confusion and ignorance of so many on our moral and ethical obligation in caring for sick and dying persons. In such a developing climate, which approves involuntary euthanasia, The Family Care Decisions Act puts vulnerable patients at great risk at a time when they are substantially weakened or unable to defend or advocate for themselves.

Action-Sample message to your Senator and Assembly Member:

: I am strongly opposed to the Family Health Care Dear Decisions Act S.4296/A.5406 in its current form. The intent of the bill is to ensure that a surrogate's decision on behalf of a patient to END treatment is protected. However, some provisions of the bill do not protect such patients and their family members because it does not protect life-sustaining treatment decisions. For example, the bill allows physicians to place Do-Not-Resuscitate orders on patients without their knowledge, even though the patient is fully conscious and mentally competent. The bill would also allow a private hospital or individual health provider to override a decision for life-sustaining treatment under the guise of conscience protection, if the hospital or other provider decides that the patient's life is not worth preserving because it doesn't meet the doctor's quality of life standards. (Conscience section should be subject to the critical transfer language of the bill.) The Health Care Decisions Act would authorize involuntary euthanasia. It is important you oppose S.4296/A.5406. Please reply.

THE POPULATION POLICE -ARE WE FAR BEHIND CHINA?



The November 3, 2005 edition of lifenews.com reported on the continued house arrest of blind activist Chen Guangcheng. Chen was abducted and put under house arrest after speaking with reporters from the Washington Post and Time magazine. He has also been assaulted twice for attempting to leave. Chen stated that 7,000 women were forcibly aborted or sterilized in the months before he spoke with the reporters. The San Francisco Chronicle reported on Zhu Hongying, who hid in the city of Linyi with her family when she was five months pregnant with her second child. Chinese officials arrested three of her sisters "to force her to come out of hiding... The family planning department demanded 700RMB (about \$90, two month's wages for Zhu) to release my sisters-in-law, and then they pushed me into a van and took me to a local family planning clinic. Once there, eight officials surrounded her and coerced her into agreeing to have an abortion...After she had the abortion...a nurse came back into the room and placed the baby in a black plastic bag. She told me to go throw it into a truck, which had a large container kind of thing at the back...When I opened the door and looked in, it was full of bags and blood." A week later, Zhu was arrested again and held for ransom because one of her sisters was pregnant. Another fine was paid and the sister was forced to abort her child also. Chen Guangcheng stated "...as the population in Shandong has ballooned, I think the provincial government put pressure on the local family planning departments, who've just gone nuts."

The November 2, 2005 Wednesday STOPP (Stop Planned Parenthood) Report contained an article entitled "Planned Parenthood - The future invented". It referred to a recent item in the October 12, 2005 Citizen Link Daily Update from Focus on the Family. Apparently the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) are considering a recommendation requiring HPV (human papillomavirus) vaccinations for every 12 year old – thus requiring boys and girls to be vaccinated for this sexually transmitted disease before entering middle school. STOPP states that this should be a wake-up call. In 1987, Planned Parenthood was involved in writing the document "Inventing the Future: Alternatives to Adolescent Pregnancy". This document established their goals for the 21st Century. The "Protect Our Young People:

Immunize" section of the document contained the following:

"In 2008, a female was elected President of the United States. In her State of the Union message, she advocated conception immunization of all preteen boys girls within the United States. Reversal and immunization, after extensive counseling, was made available upon request. Within six months, conceptionimmunization clinics were established across the country. Within a year pregnancy occurred to almost no one under the age of 18, and to very few young people under 21...A fictional person makes the following statement years after the conception-immunization program is implemented: 'Remember when people first realized that immunizations were mandatory? I was surprised at the number of people who were supportive of the idea. I think they finally realized this was the only way to have a real impact on the teenage pregnancy problem. I must admit it was strange to see the conception immunization on the school health form.""

The Clinton administration announced during the Cairo conference in the 1990's that the US government was working on immuno-contraceptives. The STOPP report reminds us of the following: It is easier to prevent implantation than to prevent fertilization. Therefore immunizations will most likely work by allowing fertilization but preventing implantation, which is abortion. Once the children are vaccinated, who will grant parenthood permission? Who will distribute the "reversal drug"? Who will be given the drug? Will physical and mental testing be required to allow only the "fittest" to become parents? As we can see, this all leads back to Planned Parenthood's eugenicist roots. Any STD/Pregnancy vaccination ignores the fact that if children are not sexually active, they will never require such a "preventive" measure. But PP always puts a "spin" on the issue so that they can put up a good front. Who, in their right mind, would fight against something that "prevents disease"? Only Planned Parenthood could warp the issue to such a degree. The article states "...we here at STOPP are alerting you that the real purpose of this is to move us closer to mandatory conception immunization - an event that will lead us into a whole host of problems much too numerous to adequately cover in this article. We know that some of you will think we are paranoid. To you we simply say, just because you're paranoid doesn't mean someone isn't out to get you. Please fight this HPV immunization, and all similar immunizations, with every ounce of strength you have. Let the CDC know you will not stand for this."

OTTO ERNEST BUCHTA - 1913-2005

" In illa hora dabitur vobis quid diceris. (Latin) - In that hour it shall be given unto you what to say."

My father, Otto Ernest Buchta, was a voracious reader and voluminous writer. He did not waste his precious earthly life watching the Jets or the Giants or much TV at all. He was either reading one of the lives of the Saints, an encyclical of one of the popes or some prayer or meditation or saying of the rosary. This was only for the last 60+ years. Prior to that in his late teen's, and early 20's he was striving to become a "fellow traveler" - a card carrying communist.

Then he heard the "radio priest", Father Charles E. Coughlin. The change it made in his life was profound; converting to the Roman Catholic Church. Next, he met my mother and his life was again improved greatly. In the words of Father Couglin, "We want women to have an education but we don't want them to be engineers or pilots or other such fanciful things. The Blessed Virgin was no preacher of sermons. But she was an apostle of goodness. Woman has no place on man's level. She belongs above it. Women have finer passions, finer appreciation of beauty, finer depth of love..." Otto was not a speech giver but his action's spoke volumes as to who he was and what he believed. Most of all he believed in God's creation and the sanctity of human life.

He was not one to complain when he suffered. In the last year of his life he suffered much. He told me one day to find what Father Coughlin (his hero) said about suffering. "It is those whom Christ loves most who suffer most. Christ, who loved Peter, caressed him with an upturned cross. St John was priced with a boiling caldron. He kissed his blessed mother and sealed it with the seven words of sorrow. It has been so all down the centuries. Love of God, and God's love for us go hand in hand with sorrow.

I now know my father by what he said in his last "hour".

Dr. Farcasiu's Petition Project, An Update

Energized by Dr. Dan Farcasiu's talk at our 4/25/05 meeting, many pro-life groups hosted petition signings.

The Long Island Coalition for Life attempted to help by asking pro-life legislators to support Dr.Farcasiu's objectives. To our surprise legislators who have recently sponsored pro-life bills found the research accompanying the petition insufficient to support legislation.

An additional concern voiced by national and NYS prolife organizations is that a drive to label products using or derived from fetal or embryonic tissue would interfere with the overall objective of outlawing such use. It might even appear as though we are condoning the use of these products as long as they are labeled.

Dr. Farcasiu is to be praised for his sincere intentions but at this time the Long Island Coalition for Life feels this petition will not produce the desired result and may be counter-productive.
