POSITIONS ON LIFE ISSUES: Since lower offices are frequently used as stepping-stones to higher ones, it is important to scrutinize a candidate's credentials for ALL offices before voting.

Today's county legislator may be tomorrow's Congressman,
Governor or Senator...

Some VOTING TIPS from Priests for Life:

- = VOTE! Voting is a moral obligation. If you're out of state or are homebound, use an absentee ballot.
- = REJECT THE DISQUALIFIED If a candidate came forward and said, "I support terrorism," you wouldn't say, "I disagree with you on terrorism, but what's your health care plan?" Similarly, those who permit the destruction of innocent life by abortion disqualify themselves from consideration.
- = WEIGH ISSUES PROPERLY Not all issues have equal weight. War & capital punishment, for example, may at times be morally justified, but abortion and euthanasia never are.
- = DISTINGUISH POLICY FROM PRINCIPLE Most disagreements between candidates & political platforms do not have to do with principle ("Is there a 'Right to Crime?"), but rather with policy ("How do we reduce crime?") But the dispute over whether there is a right to life does deal with principle, and is therefore more fundamental.
- = KEEP YOUR LOYALTY FOCUSED ON JESUS Your loyalty to Jesus Christ must be stronger than your loyalty to ANY political party.
- = DISTINGUISH 'CHOOSING EVIL' FROM 'LIMITING EVIL' If two opposing candidates both support abortion, then ask: Which of the two candidates will do less harm to unborn children? This is not 'choosing the lesser of two evils," but rather choosing to limit an evil, and this is a good.
- = SUPPORT THE CANDIDATE WITH MORE THAN YOUR VOTE Make a donation, volunteer for the campaign, hand out literature, make phone calls, send e-mails, display bumper stickers & yard signs, etc.
- = MOBILIZE AS MANY OTHER VOTERS AS POSSIBLE! Elections are not contests between two candidates. They are contests between two teams. The bigger and more active team will bring in the most votes.
- = PRAY Bring your voting decisions to prayer, and pray for your candidate!


REASONS FOR HOPE

As a pro-life individual living in one of the most liberal states in the country (New York), I often feel like the pro-life groups are fighting an endless, up-hill battle. However, a few years ago, I experienced an incident that gave me hope. I was asked to share it so that those who read this can have

hope, and know that they are not fighting in vain.

A few years ago, in English for a final exam, I needed to write a research/position paper on a controversial issue of my choosing; I chose abortion, from the pro-life perspective. About halfway to the deadline, my teacher met individually with each student to discuss the progress on each paper. During my conference, I asked my teacher how many other students of her's had chosen the same topic as myself. She told me that six students had chosen abortion. I had assumed that the majority of them had chosen to write it in support of the pro-abortion viewpoint. However, my teacher told me that to her surprise, all of the students had chosen to support the pro-life position.

Every time I think of this incident my-hope is renewed. I know that there are youth like myself out there who know that abortion is wrong, and when they get the chance, they will do something about it. So if you ever feel like today's youth do not feel passionately about our responsibility to preserve life from conception, remember this brief story, and know that there are those who will take up the fight in later generations.

Why? Because Bill Clinton was doing what NARAL (National Abortion Rights Action League) and Planned Parenthood wanted him to do.


On his first day in office:

When Is A "Good" Organization Not Good Enough To Support?



Rotary International and United Nations Population Fund

A dilemma faced by many pro-lifers is deciding when a "good" organization is not good enough to support. Unfortunately, examples are easy to find. Rotary International helps stops the spread of child-hood diseases. March of Dimes helps mothers prevent premature births. The Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation helps eradicate a deadly disease. Girl Scouts offers good learning experiences for young girls. BUT! Rotary has joined forces with one of the world's most aggressive abortion advocates. March of Dimes promotes genetic testing that often leads to aborting imperfect fetuses. The Komen Foundation gives grants to Planned Parenthood. Girl Scouts won't unequivocally stop any association with Planned Parenthood Federation.

So when you go to the Rotary pancake breakfast, join the March of Dimes Walk-A-Thon, donate to the Komen Foundation, or buy Girl Scout cookies, you not only support a good cause, but you also aid and give legitimacy to an organization that uses funds against the right to life of preborn humans. Why so many good organizations decided they needed to get into the abortion business, directly or indirectly, is unclear. Pro-lifers need to tell those "good" organizations to get out of the abortion business and until they do we'll stop supporting them and stop buying their products.

Rotary International (RI) is holding its 2006 Rotary-UN Day on November 4, 2006 at the United Nations in New York City. Despite the good programs from the Rotary-UN alliance, there is a darker side to their union, specifically the Memorandum of Cooperation signed between Rotary International and the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA, formerly United Nations Fund for Population Activities). The pact was initially signed in 2001, renewed in 2002 for three years and renewed again in November 2005 for three more years.

The Memorandum sets out the goal for RI and UNFPA "to work together on population and reproductive health issues and promote awareness world-wide of the social, economic and environmental implications of population growth and challenges." As announced in a joint press release in June 2001, the Rotary was to "promote population and development projects - especially those to delay the first birth, promote child spacing and enhance the status of women..." Astute pro-lifers familiar with anti-life efforts within the United Nations recognize the code words here for family planning that includes unlimited access to abortion for even pre-teen girls.


In 1999, the RI Board adopted a statement on population growth and sustainable development, which reads in part: "Rotary International encourages Rotary clubs and districts, working as appropriate with government agencies, nongovernmental organizations and local leadership, to increase awareness and undertake even more projects that directly impact population growth and sustainable development. Projects would include those that promote education on the issue of population, access to family health care, adequate nutrition, and enable individuals to make informed and responsible decisions about issues such as child spacing in a way that is in keeping with their personal values and cultural and religious considerations."

The UNFPA mission statement reads, in part, that the UNFPA supports programs "to ensure that every pregnancy is wanted..." In addition, UNFPA holds that there are close links between sustainable development and reproductive health and gender equality, thus one of its goals is to achieve "universal access to reproductive health services by 2015." Translation - ready access to abortion will take care of "unwanted" babies. UNFPA believes "Reproductive health is also a human right." But being born isn't? [www.unfpa.org/about/index.htm]

In an interview with the Catholic Family and Human Rights Institute (C-FAM), regarding the Memorandum of Cooperation, a spokesman for Rotary told C-FAM that Rotary's association with UNFPA accounts for only a "miniscule" portion of Rotary programs. Oh, so that makes it ok to kill preborn babies because it's only a small part of Rotary's business? Let your local Rotary know that even a little bit of abortion is too much!
