FEDERAL LEGISLATION

ELENA KAGAN CONFIRMED, 8/5/2010, AS U.S. SUPREME COURT JUSTICE by a 63-37 vote. Opponents note this is the lowest number of YES votes for a Democratic nominee in 100 years, and hope it signals

increased willingness to fight judicial activists.

DISCLOSE ACT- (H.R.5175) – Passed by the House in June, a 7/29 Senate vote failed to end debate on the DISCLOSE Act. Though it has not passed for now, Senators Reid & Schumer vow they will bring it back until it is passed.

NOTE: It is the feeling in pro-life circles that Rep. McCarthy's [D-NY] NO vote on DISCLOSE was anti-NRA, not pro-life.

NO TAXPAYER FUNDING FOR ABORTION ACT by Rep Chris Smith [R-NJ], rolls into one bill- - health provider conscience protection, Hyde Amendment prohibitions, plus no funding for overseas abortions, or federal employee elective abortions, or abortions in DC funded by Congress. AND these bans would not have to be renewed each year, as they are now. Rep P. King [R-NY] is a cosponsor.

SAMPLE MESSAGE to House Members: (Contact info below) Please co-sponsor and promote the No Taxpayer Funding For Abortion Act (H.R.5939). It will make permanent all current bans on Federal funding of (most) abortions and includes conscience protection.

STOP DECEPTIVE ADVERTISING FOR WOMEN'S SERVICES ACT introduced 6/30/10 by Rep. C. Maloney [D-NY] & Sen. Menendez [D-NJ] would regulate advertising by pregnancy centers that do <u>not</u> offer abortions. *Heartbeat International* says it's an attempt to keep women from "connecting with life-affirming pregnancy centers."

SAMPLE MESSAGE to House Members: Please oppose the Stop Deceptive Advertising for Women's Services Act, H.R.5652. It would keep women from connecting with lifeaffirming pregnancy centers by restricting their advertising.

OBAMACARE & ABORTION-The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ObamaCare) passed on a promised Executive Order banning PPACA from covering abortions. Pro-life groups said the Order was inadequate. In July, the National Right to Life Comm. alleged the federal 'Pre-existing Condition Insurance Plans' program, (a PPACA high-risk insurance pool), would cover elective abortions in PA, NM, MD and soon other states. After initially denying abortions would be covered, the HHS Administration issued regulations prohibiting abortion coverage, except for rape, incest, or life of the mother. But pro-life groups still question the regulation's effectiveness, as they reference the Executive Order, and non-PPACA funded programs. Meanwhile, 21 pro-abort House members have decried the promise of no PCIP abortion funding.

THE MARCH FOR LIFE AND FEDERAL

LEGISLATION. March for Life President, Nellie Gray, has always urged marchers to visit their legislators. If 1/22 falls on a weekend, the March is moved to a Monday, as in 1/24/2011, when offices are open. Due to the length of the March plus security at buildings, visiting legislators <u>after the March</u> has become next to impossible and many skip this vital part of their trip to Washington. Alternatives suggested include:

- (a) arrive in Wash. at 10 or10:30 AM to allow group to visit representatives before marching;
- (b) arrive in Wash. at 11:30 AM with each group having designated four/five experienced lobbyists to go directly to the offices. These may miss the March, or part of, but your legislators will know his/her constituents, your school, church, etc. attended the March.
- (c) have the entire group lobby after the March if that has been successful.

Please let us know of other possible options. There is a serious need to lobby for pro-life legislation and to support legislators who have introduced pro-life legislation (see above). Call LICL 631-243-1435 before December with time you plan to lobby. You or LICL must set up the appointments. <u>Good News</u>: No action to date, 8/9, on the dangerous Reproductive Health Act

S.5808. Contact your NYS Senator to vote no (see 6/2010 Life News). Reps can be called to Albany to vote on existing legislation through 12/31/10.

HEALTH & SCIENCE IVF & GIFT



Couples who are unable to conceive may face an ethical dilemma when doctors suggest

assisted reproductive technology. In vitro fertilization (IVF) is often recommended to these couples. IVF consists of the following 5 steps:

1) Stimulating and monitoring the development of healthy eggs in the ovaries (ovulation induction) through the use of fertility medications. Multiple eggs are required since some eggs will not fertilize or develop. Hormone levels are checked through urine and blood tests.

2) Retrieving the ova through a laparoscopy. Ultrasound is used to guide a hollow needle through the pelvic cavity. Anesthesia is used for this process. The eggs are removed from the ovaries with the hollow needle. This process is called follicular aspiration. The ova are examined under a microscope to determine maturity.

3) Collecting the sperm. Semen is usually obtained through ejaculation/masturbation. The semen is processed in a centrifuge, washed and placed in a test tube so that the active sperm can swim to the top.

4) Combining the eggs and sperm in the laboratory (insemination) and providing the appropriate environment for fertilization and early embryo growth. If the doctors anticipate a low fertilization rate, intracytoplasmic sperm injection may be used. This process involves injecting a single sperm into the egg. Continuous monitoring is done to confirm fertilization and cell division.

5) Transferring the embryos into the uterus. This process is usually done between two and three days after egg retrieval. A speculum is inserted into the vagina to expose the cervix. A predetermined number of eggs are suspended in fluid and inserted into the womb through a catheter.

Many couples may object to this procedure for religious, moral, or ethical reasons. The ova and sperm are obtained outside the marital act. Often "extra" eggs are saved for subsequent IVF procedures and embryos may be frozen for later implantation. When a multifetal pregnancy occurs using IVF, often 'pregnancy reduction' (abortion) is recommended to reduce the number of fetuses.

In 1984, Dr. Ricardo Asch and associates at the University of Texas Health Science Center developed the GIFT (Gamete Intrafallopian Transfer) procedure. This procedure is often recommended for couples with unexplained infertility when the woman has at least one open fallopian tube. It can also be used by patients with cervical or immunological factors, mild endometriosis and some instances of male infertility.

The GIFT procedure is a variation of IVF. The significant difference is that the intention is for fertilization to occur naturally within the woman's body, and not in the laboratory. The use of GIFT by marital spouses is acceptable by certain religions providing the following:

1) Retrieval of ova and sperm must follow a natural act of sexual intercourse, 2) Sperm must be collected from that act of intercourse by morally acceptable means, 3) The procedure must be carried out in such a way as to avoid the possibility of extracorporeal conception, 4) Any ova collected but not transferred back into the woman's body must not be fertilized in vitro, with the resulting embryos frozen for later implantation, 5) Should a multifetal pregnancy result through the use of the GIFT procedure, pregnancy reduction, that is, the abortion of some of the fetuses, is not permissible.

The underlying principle behind the development of this procedure is to ensure that assistance does not separate the unitive and procreative ends of the marital act of sexual intercourse and does not substitute for the marital act itself. The Rev. Donald McCarthy of the Pope John XXIII Center stated, "The conjugal act in the described procedure remains the essential step in getting the ovum and sperm to meet. This step is followed by the repositioning of the ovum and sperm in a manner which markedly increases the likelihood of fertilization. Hence, GIFT...can be seen as a medical procedure which assists, rather than replaces, the conjugal act..."

However, there are those who object to the GIFT procedure, stating that it not so much assists as substitutes for the conjugal act to achieve conception. William May stated, "In the GIFT procedure the conjugal act is in truth incidental and not essential to the achievement of pregnancy...There is a complete dissociation between the marital act and the technical method which leads to conception...The only reason to engage in the marital act is to obtain the sperm in a non-masturbatory way." Supporters of the GIFT procedure argue that if the procedure includes the use of a perforated condom during an act of sexual intercourse, some sperm does enter the woman's body, and therefore the possibility exists that fertilization can occur through intercourse.

John Hass argued, "... the intrinsic link between coitus and new life is broken by the intervening human acts. It would seem that the new life is more the result of the actions of technicians and medical personnel rather than the act of love between a husband and a wife." Peter Cataldo replied, "The following interventions taken singly (and in conjunction with the conjugal act) are considered licit as means to overcome infertility: collecting semen with a perforated Silastic sheath; placing it in a syringe, injecting semen into the uterus, treating the sperm, the use of ovulatory drugs, laparoscopic retrieval of eggs, and injection of eggs into the fallopian tubes at an atypical site. Thus what are considered individually licit interventions become illicit in GIFT because there are too many of them. It is the number as such, the total number of interventions, which is found objectionable. Further proof of this is seen from the fact that the very thing which makes each intervention licit individually is that each does not violate the intrinsic link between conjugal act and procreation. If the very thing needing to be preserved is preserved individually by each, then the reason for the rejection of those same procedures must be the size of their number taken in combination. Hence there must be some threshold number which makes the moral difference between assistance and replacement for those who disapprove of GIFT. But what is that number, and how is it to be determined? In fact, there cannot be such a threshold because it cannot be objectively determined...The number of steps in between conjugal act and fertilization is not morally decisive for the difference between assistance and replacement "

GUIDELINES for PRO-LIFE PRESENCE at ABORTIONISTS' SITES and PRO-LIFE EVENTS

All public witnessing (praying, sidewalk counseling, etc.) MUST BE PEACEFUL. This is legal <u>nonviolent</u> direct action.

Public pro-life outreach is a statement on behalf of all of the victims of abortion.

Your presence at an abortion "clinic" or abortionist's office or your participation in a public awareness event is an important affirmation of LIFE, exercise of your Constitutional right to free speech and assembly, and a witness against the tragedy of abortion.

Babies are dying at the hands of abortionists and their staff. Treat the site appropriately. Eating, drinking, loud talking and laughter are out of place.

Stay on sidewalks (public property).

Do not go on the facility's property or parking lot.

Do not block/impede access of cars to driveways or pedestrians to doors or along sidewalks.

- Stay with a partner.
- Carry a camera and cell phone.
- Use signs and hold them so they can be read by vehicle and/or pedestrian traffic
- Carry a pro-life pamphlet with pro-life assistance contact info.
- Praying, singing, and Scripture reading should be done without disturbing other pro-lifers who aren't joining your group.
- Do Not Shout at patients, workers, residents, drivers, police, etc.
- Do not shadow (follow continuously and closely) pedestrians.
- Respond to hecklers gently or not at all. Leave them with a positive life-affirming comment

Your pro-life witness is seen by those contemplating abortion, those who know or will know someone with an untimely pregnancy, and those hurt by a past abortion decision. It is critical in keeping the plight of the unborn on the public conscience and saving lives.
