



Dear Defenders of Life,

There are many ways you can support the pro-life cause. You can do it through prayer, peaceful protests at abortion mills, and letters to editorial pages. You can also lobby against anti-life legislation like the so-called Reproductive Health Act in the New York State legislature which would enshrine in New York State law abortion on demand through all nine months of pregnancy. Finally you can support the pro-life cause through a financial contribution.

It is the last I am asking for in this letter. All of your contributions go directly to pro-life work. None of our officers or committee members receive any financial compensation. We are a totally volunteer organization. Our main purpose is educational. We publish our newsletter, *Life News*. We send speakers free of charge to high schools and colleges here on Long Island. We have sponsored training sessions for pro-life people so that they can spread the pro-life message to relatives, friends, and coworkers in a loving and respectful manner. We sponsor the largest pro-life event on Long Island, Stand Up For Life, on the first Sunday of October. This is a peaceful protest in front of the Huntington Mall on Rt.110 and in Manorville, L.I. We also provide pro-life booths at community events, like street fairs, complete with fetal models of the unborn.

All of these efforts cost money. There have been fifty-five million abortions in the U.S. since the infamo as Supreme Court decision, Roe v. Wade in 1973. We know through modern ultrasound technology that these are tiny innocent human beings that are being killed. Abortion is not a religious issue. It is the fundamental human rights issue of our time. Our founding document the Declaration of Independence says that every human being has an inalienable right-to-life.

It is the old sad story that has been repeated down through the ages, those with power exclude from the luman community some human beings without power. Slavery, genocide and abortion all spring from the same poisoned well: the end justifies any means; might makes right; the weak can be destroyed by the strong.

FEDERAL LEGISLATION

Some members of the LICL have made the staff of *LifeNews* aware of replies they have received from their member of Congress - letters which defend the HHS contraceptive/sterilization/abortifacient mandate. Quoting

the 10/18/13 letter from Rep. Bishop as an example, (quotes are bolded), this column will respond to the three main points Rep. Bishop makes in defense of the mandate:

1) "As you may know, a provision in the Affordable Care Act requires insurance companies to cover contraception without a co-pay. This requirement also includes a "conscience clause," wherein a religious organization whose doctrine prohibits contraception would be able to opt out of this rule, but only if their employees were predominantly of the same religion. It is important to note that this provision has been the law in New York since 2002." The Pro-Life reply - The NYS 'Clause' was part of the Women's Health & Wellness Act. Dennis Poust, (NYS Catholic Conference) called it... "a useless conscience clause." [See NY Times: April 4, 2002 & June 13, 2002] As the Becket Fund points out, with state mandates, "...religious organizations can simply opt out by selfinsuring, or dropping prescription drug coverage." But the HHS Mandate requires "no cost" contraceptive & sterilization coverage for almost all persons.*

2) "Some groups, including a number of Catholic charities and hospitals, view this clause as too narrow, excluding religious organizations whose employees are not predominantly of that religion. In response, the Obama administration announced a compromise where the cost of providing birth control coverage is taken on wholly by the insurer, not the organization. This modification has been welcomed by a number of religious affiliated organizations, including the Catholic Health Association, Catholic Charities, and the Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities. I believe this modification to the rule protects rights of conscience while also guaranteeing that women will have access to free birth control."

The Pro-Life reply - This puts the Federal Government in charge of deciding what IS or IS NOT a religious institution. As James Madison said "Religion is wholly exempt from [the] cognizance" of political authority. [Memorial and Remonstrance Against Religious Assessments - 1785] Administration officials speak of "freedom of worship," not of broader "freedom of religion." As Cardinal George has said "...in the...former USSR...the church...could do nothing except conduct religious rites in places of worship -- no schools, religious publications, health care institutions, organized charity, ministry for justice and the works of mercy that flow

naturally from a living faith. All of these were co-opted by the government...." Following release of the HHS Mandate's final version (6/28/13), the US Conf. of Catholic Bishops said the "Accommodation" it contained addressed neither religious ministries or faithful secular employers. It was "a shell game" in which the insurers claimed to provide the objectionable services "for free," while the Church paid for everything else. [see www.USCCB.org] The Assoc. of Jesuit Colleges & U's, and Catholic Health Assoc. (not to be confused with the Catholic Medical Assoc., which opposes the Mandate) are both in support of the HHS Mandate. When the first 'Accommodation' was announced last year, Catholic Charities quickly said they were glad, but then withdrew support upon reflection. Catholic Charities is now part of many lawsuits against the Mandate. [see BecketFund.org]

3) "I support the right of women to make their own decisions regarding reproductive health, and thus I support access to affordable birth control. One way to decrease the instance of abortion is by working to see that women have the resources and information they need to prevent unintended pregnancies. I will continue to work to ensure that all women have access to safe and affordable contraception." The Pro-Life reply - The Alan Guttmacher Institute is the former statistics wing of Planned Parenthood. Their 2006 and 2008 reports show that: 54% of woman were using the pill or a condom during the month they became pregnant, and women who have never used any birth control method account for 8% of abortions. Keith Riler suggests in Americanthinker.com (3/24/12) that most people who go on contraception are planning increased rates of sex. Thus, more pregnancies. See www.lifenews.com/2011/01/11/report-showscontraception-failure-54-used-before-abortion, and www.womensissues.about.com/od/reproductiverights/ tp/Ten-Abortion-Facts.htm.

* NOTES: a) Sterilization is a *surgical* procedure. b) *Plan B* and *ella* (morning after pills) are covered. We say they are abortifacients, because *Plan B's* BOX has the warning: "It may also prevent fertilization of a released egg...or attachment of a fertilized egg to the uterus (implantation)." www.accessdata.fda.gov/drugsatfda_docs/label/2006/021045s011lbl.pdf

PVS, Euthanasia, & Assisted Suicide



Wesley J. Smith's article, 'The V-Word is as Bad as the N-Word' at www.firstthings.com (11/1/13) states, "Using the word 'vegetable' to describe people with a cognitive disability or impairment is profoundly dehumanizing. The victims of this characterization are as diverse as America: Members of the castigated class come from all races, ages, nationalities, genders, sexual orientations, and any other human identifier one can conjure. Indeed, any one of us could find ourselves entered among this disparaged group, and all of us have-or had-loved ones who could be so identified. [the V-word serves] to cast aspersion, debase, and degrade-toward the end that the victims of the epithet be seen as a lower order of being-and hence, as less worthy of respect and dignity."

Smith continued by recalling an episode of Family Guy which referred to Terri Schiavo as having 'mashed potato brains. "There is more at stake here than hurt feelings. Demeaning any human being as no more important than a rutabaga opens the door to profound abuse. Indeed every day people with profound cognitive impairments are made to die slowly by dehydration by being denied tube-supplied food and water...It would have once been unthinkable to deny helpless patients basic sustenance. But as the cognitively impaired have become increasingly dehumanizedbeing branded 'non-persons' by mainstream thinkers in bioethics, is another example-it has become easier to do to them what is a horrible crime if done to a dog or horse. Not only that, if we come to see the cognitively devastated as merely the moral equivalent of plant matter, what's to stop us from harvesting their organs as we reap corn or wheat? Indeed, advocacy to do just that is becoming ubiquitous in the world's most influential medical and bioethics journals. For example, earlier this year an article published in the New England Journal of Medicine advocated 'changing homicide laws' so that organs could be removed from cognitively devastated patients before they die."

Smith acknowledges that this type of 'harvesting' is not happening yet, but he warns us that it has become 'respectable' to argue for it. He concludes, "Activists who struggle against racism and other forms of discriminatory thinking have long understood that the words we use matter in how we treat others. The same is true for our cognitively devastated brothers and sisters. If we are to have a truly equal and moral society, if our health care system is to have any chance of caring properly for the least of those among us, to use a Biblical turn of phrase, we need to watch our mouths as a means of cleansing our hearts. A good place would be to stop using the V-word to define any human being."

The website www.bioedge.org contained an article by Xavier Symons, 'Leading academics endorse euthanasia for

the 'weary in spirit'" (11/2/13), which states that bioe hicists are now supporting euthanasia for those "weary of life". Symons reports that articles in the Journal of Medical Ethics push for law reform and "suggest that euthana ia is ultimately justified by existential suffering - a despair in life - and not some kind of physical illness. As existential suffering can come in many forms, be it a 'diagnosable' illness or non-medical despair, it should be permitted for those who, though not ill, have lost hope and have no prospect of regaining meaning in their lives." Symons states that one of the authors, Jukka Varelius, "suggests that questions of the worth, meaning and value of life are the key considerations when deciding whether to grant e thanasia. He proposes that the presence of medical illne is may not be as important a consideration as we once thought."

Michael Cook reported on 11/9/13 at www.bioedge.org ("Belgian debate over child euthanasia heats up") that Belgium doctors are now debating euthanasia for minors. An open letter by 16 pediatricians asked, "Why deprive ninors of this last possibility? Experience shows us that in cases of serious illness and imminent death, minors cevelop very quickly a great maturity, to the point where they are often better able to reflect and express themselves than healthy people." The letter acknowledges that the practice is already taking place and legalization will take it out of a "dark zone".

Wesley J. Smith reported at www.nationalreview.com on 11/8/13 (Oregon Tightens Duty to Die on Cancer Patients) that Oregon is further limiting access to care for low-income patients in their Medicaid program. Smi h quotes from an opinion piece by Peter J Pitts in the Statesman Journal, "These new guidelines require that Medicaid deny coverage for certain cancer treatments for patie its that have been deemed 'too' sick, haven't responded well to previous treatments, or can't care for themselves...Or egon bureaucrats are severely restricting access to care and dooming potentially thousands of local patients to a premature death...Oregon's new Medicaid guidelines take treatment decisions out of the hands of doctors and patier ts and put them in the hands of distant state bureaucrats willing to cut costs no matter the human toll." Judy Brown at American Life League states, "It is vi ally important to understand that everyone's most basic rightthe right to life-is in jeopardy when our law and collective morality no longer view all persons as equally worth of life, solely on the basis of our common humanity...w > must educate ourselves and others about the growing threat of euthanasia, vigorously oppose its legalization and pray for the wisdom and compassion to properly con fort, care for and dissuade those considering suicide."


